As I write this final note to you, the weather is turning cooler. We have finally had some rain and nature is looking a little better with the nourishment. The fall season will soon be upon us bringing changes in temperature, landscape, and activity. I appreciate the changing seasons, even if they can become harsh. It is the reality of life that change is all around us and in us. And in faith, we know that change is what God desires in us—transformation—so that we live out the great gift of Jesus by a God who loves beyond measure.

But that doesn't mean it's easy or that we understand what God is doing in us and in others. That is why prayer is so important to me; it is a time of reflection, listening, and quiet contemplation. And yes, there are times where I lean into it more than others. And so, if in those few moments, I can see God's work in you all, imagine how much more is going on outside of this place in God's name! It is easy to get discouraged and wish for things that were, but often when we do that, we miss what is going on right now.

To be sure, the church is in flux—but it always has been and will continue to be. Because life <u>is</u> change. As you come to worship and hear the Word this month, Jesus teaches what faith looks like, and how it manifests itself. Humility, thankfulness, hope, relentless belief, trust, and crying out for help to the one whom we belong to, are just some of the teachings from Jesus. Just imagine how much *more* we are provided with by the Eternal One so that we may live a free and full life! I pray that you all continue moving forward to where God is calling you as a community, listening and responding in faith. It has been a true blessing to be with you—thank you for your generous spirits, friendship, and hospitality. May you all see and use what you have been provided, to live out God's mission in faith, to the glory of the one whose name is above all names, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Devotions: The meeting opened with devotions on Luke 13 & 14 by Wade Markel. He provided a synopsis of the two chapters and shared his personal meanings of the passages. Next month's devotion will be by Krista Meluzio-Zellers on Luke 15 & 16.

Thank You Cards: Thank you cards to be sent to Keith Plowman and Terry Turko for installing the security cameras and to Annie Connolly for serving as youth representative to Council. Regina to write the cards.

Minutes: The minutes from the July 19, 2022 meeting were submitted by Jim Rowlands. The minutes were approved with one typo corrected on motion by Trevor Hoffman, seconded by Al Abruzzese.

Treasurer's Report: Wade Markel presented the July, 2022 treasurer report. We are 58% into the year. Income year to date stands at 62% of budget (50% without tax refund) and expenses stand at 59%. We have a year to date deficit of \$25,515 versus a year to date budgeted deficit of \$32,924. The Treasurer's report was approved as submitted on motion by Regina Peckmann, seconded by Andrew Doerr.

Investment Treasurer Report: Trevor Hoffman submitted the July, 2022 report. There were no transactions this month. Jim Rowlands made a motion that the "music groups" designated fund to be re-designated as the "Falkenstein Vocal Scholarship Designated Fund" and fund up to \$500 in vocal scholarships for the next year. Motion seconded and approved.

Membership Report: Denise presented the attendance report. There were no membership actions requiring approval. **Pastor Martha Boyd's Report:** Pastor Boyd submitted a written report detailing her activities in the month of July.

CYFM Report: Chuck Bissell submitted a written report. Chuck to be asked to recommend potential Youth Representatives to Council.

Parish Administrator's Report: Denise Moyer submitted a written report. The new refrigerator has arrived, was installed and is cold! A new AV computer has been purchased. She is investigating changing the light bulbs in the front of the sanctuary to improve lighting for live streaming. There were suggestions to try to increase the zoom during the sermon.

On motion by Jim Rowlands, up to \$500 from council benevolence designated fund be allocated as a congregational match to the Habitat for Humanity Faith Build. Motion seconded by Wade Markel and passed.

Old Business

- Return Task Force - No actions necessary this month

New Business

- Council Retreat - The council retreat with Dr Albert has been finalized for October 16th.

- Racism Awareness Group - Kim Alloway reported the Racism Awareness Group is working on planning fall activities.

- VBS - VBS was held the week of July 11th. It went well. Less attendance than pre-covid. More of the children were from outside the congregation than normal.

- 175th Anniversary - The committee is meeting bi-weekly. Coming together. Start to advertise to congregation.

- Visioning - Council continued the brainstorming session. A synopsis to be generated by Jim Rowlands for comment and eventual distribution to Dr. Albert for use in the October retreat.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 8:15 on motion by Trevor Hoffman, seconded by Al Abruzzese.
