Happy November to everyone! I was thinking about how I am constantly writing about the different activities that are happening and if you see me on Sunday morning going through Zest for Zion you get some snippets about the things we do. I realized that I am speaking to the room like they know EX-ACTLY what is available to the youth of our community and our congregation. Because of this realization I decided that I want to take this month to go through the different things that Zion offers for those in their first third of life.

The first thing that I would like to call attention to is our Sunday morning Faith Formation programs. I know some of you are used to calling it Sunday School and I do as well on occasion. My thought process is while some kids love school they don't want to think about it on the weekend. Calling it "faith formation" allows the kids to look forward to something great that is going to help them explore their faith life. We offer classes for Pre-K through 12th grade for our students. We also offer two adult FF classes. One focuses on reading through the Bible. Don't feel like you must catch up on the reading to attend. LOL That class is happy to have you regardless of what page you are on in your Bible. The other adult class explores our "Life with Jesus". They cover various topics and have fantastic discussions. Our faith formation classes meet on Sunday morning from 9am until 9:45am. For those adults that want to hang out instead of driving back home, there is space in our Fellowship Hall to relax until the classes have ended. Enjoy some coffee and conversation with some other parents.

We also hold first communion classes in the spring for those that have yet to receive it. Typically we begin this instruction during 2nd grade but if the parents feel that their child is ready and will understand we have begun sooner. Also, if you or another family member is looking for instruction and you have been baptized, there is no age too old to learn and receive their first communion.

Confirmation instruction occurs during the 7th and 8th grade years and has multiple parts to it. We have weekly Bible instruction during the faith formation year with Jim Rowlands. Over the course of two years they get what they need from the Old Testament and New Testament. We also have day long retreats that give instruction on the small catechism in a fun manner. We wrap all of this up with a camp component that takes place in June. There is a lot more to this and I am happy to explain to those that have interest. Aside from the Christian education side of things (and I didn't even mention VBS) we also have activities for our grade school aged youth ranging from fourth grade through high school. Club 456 is our youth group for our 4th through 6th graders. We meet the third Sunday of each month (schedule is subject to change) and the time is spent playing games, having snack, getting to know each other better and spending time in the Bible discussing how God works in our lives every day.

Our 7th through 12th graders get to experience Jr/Sr high youth group. These age groups allow us to explore our faith in a deeper way through conversation, activities, music, and other forms of media. Each year we have a different theme in which we build various lessons along with group retreats with other youth groups in the area. Jr/Sr high meets the 2nd Sunday of every month from 6 until 8:30pm.

There are other synod wide events that we get involved with on a yearly basis as well such as Alive and Winterfest along with churchwide events like the ELCA Youth Gathering. The next time this event takes place is July of 2024 in New Orleans. We will begin planning for this event in the Summer of 2023.

A Budget is a Statement of Faith

What does your church's annual budget represent?

Is it a proud menu of the hopes, dreams and missionary ministries your congregation wants to accomplish in the year to come?

Or is it a life-support prescription for how the congregation expects to pay the staff, keep the lights burning, the staff paid and property maintained?

In a workshop when she was stewardship officer for the Episcopal Church, the late Terry Parsons gave this "Devil's Dictionary" definition of a church budget: "It is the means by which we notify the Lord of the limitations we intend to impose on his gifts for the coming year."

If we view the budget — and present it to our congregations —as an administrative necessity to ensure proper financial management, then we shouldn't be surprised to wind up with bare-bones measures that are grudgingly funded. If funded at all.

But if we present the budget to our congregations as opportunities to invest in the Reign of God and stretch ourselves to see how much we can do with even the nickels and dimes God has given us, then the possibilities increase.

In the end, a budget is a statement about how a congregation views the future. Do your people trust that ours is the God of abundance who rewards faithful stewards and will stand behind servants who proclaim the Reign of God? If an outsider looked at your budget, what would he or she conclude about your congregation's faith?

And what would be a "God's Dictionary" definition of a church budget? How about, "It is the means by which we make the most of the abundance the Lord is giving us." Hmmm. That will look nice on the cover of the annual report.

Zion Lutheran Church Annual Meeting Minutes

DATE: November 21, 2021

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order at 10:08 by Amy Schanbacher, Congregation Council President.

Opening Prayer: An opening prayer was delivered by Pastor Janyce Jorgensen.

Determination of Quorum: After confirming the signatures of in person attendees and those joining online, Mario Saullo, Congregation Council Parliamentarian, declared a quorum of voting members to be present.

Opening Remarks: Amy Schanbacher, Congregation Council President delivered opening remarks. Her remarks focused on the application of the principles of Thanksgiving, Faith and Hope.

Pastor Janyce Jorgenson delivered opening remarks which highlighted elements of the written report she prepared and which is included in the meeting package. She is planning for her sabbatical in 2022 which was delayed in 2021 due to COVID.

2019 Annual Meeting Minutes: (The 2020 Annual Meeting was remote only and limited to essential business) A copy of the minutes from the 2019 annual meeting are included in the meeting package. Yvonne Smith made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. The motion was seconded by Jill Lordan and approved.

Questions / Discussion on Written Reports: Written reports from Pastor Janyce Jorgensen, Parish Administrator, Treasurer, Investment Treasurer, FYACM, Joyful Noise Preschool, Service Ministry, Worship and Music Committee are included in the meeting package. There were no questions or discussions on the reports.

Treasurer's Report: Wade Markel presented the August, 2022 treasurer report. We are 67% into the year. Income year to date stands at 72% of budget (61% without tax refund) and expenses stand at 74%. We have a year to date deficit of \$11,840 versus a

year to date budgeted deficit of \$25,651. Current income exceeded budget in August. The Treasurer's report was approved as submitted on motion by Jim Rowlands, seconded by Trevor Hoffman.

2022 Budget: Mario Saullo presented the proposed 2022 budget on behalf of the Finance Committee. The proposed budget is based on income being flat to the 2021 budgeted amount; limited in-person attendance due to continuing effects of COVID and an increase in JNP enrollment as COVID restrictions are reduced. The congregation council recommends approval of the proposed budget. The budget details are included in the meeting package. Jen Lau made a motion to approve the budget as presented. The motion was seconded by Mary Jane McCluskey and passed.

Second Vote on Constitution Changes: There was a second reading of the proposed Congregation Constitution Changes to sections C12.03, C13.03 and C14.03. A first reading was approved at the 2019 annual meeting. Lee Wagner made a motion to approve the changes. The motion was seconded by Doreen Meeker and was approved.

Nominating Committee Report: Jill Lordan, Chairperson of the Nominating Committee presented the following list of candidates for Congregation Council:

Krista Cunningham (second three year term) Ricardo Aguilar (first three year term) Al Abruzzese (first three year term) Wade Markel (first three year term) Kim Alloway (first three year term) Regina Peckman (first three year term) Andrew Doerr (two year term to fill vacancy)

Nominations from the floor were opened. There were none. Nominations were closed.

Jen Lau made a motion to elect the recommended candidates. The motion was seconded by Erin Ream and passed.

Jen Morris made a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Yvonne Smith and the meeting was adjourned without objection.

We have a year to date deficit of \$11,840 versus a year to date budgeted deficit of \$25,651. Current income exceeded budget in August. The Treasurer's report was approved as submitted on motion by Jim Rowlands, seconded by Trevor Hoffman.

Investment Treasurer Report: Trevor Hoffman submitted the August, 2022 report. The only transaction was a distribution from the National Gathering Designated Fund to cover the Minnesota Trip this summer.

Membership Report: Denise presented the attendance report. Pastor Jorgensen recommended for membership: Beth Updegrove and Diane Garbutt. Wade Markel seconded the motion which was passed.

Pastor Martha Boyd's Report: Pastor Boyd submitted a written report detailing her activities in the month of August

Pastor Janyce Jorgensen's Report: Pastor Jorgensen submitted a written report summarizing her sabbatical activities. Council welcomed her back!

CYFM Report: Chuck Bissell submitted a written report. Ryan Engleman provided a report on the Minnesota Mission trip.

Parish Administrator's Report: Denise Moyer submitted a written report. The service team requested \$500 be moved from the International Mission designated fund to the Guatemala Fruits and Vegetable Designated Fund which the Mechlers will match to continue our support of children in Guatemala. Kim Alloway formally made the motion which was seconded by Regina Peckmann and approved. Denise is looking for nursery attendant(s) to replace Annie Connelly who is away at college.

Old Business

New Business

- **Inactive Members:** Council decided to resume sending a letter to members not fulfilling the active member requirements of the Constitution. This was suspended for the past two years due to COVID. Denise to compile the list and send via e-mail along with the proposed letter to council for approval as soon as possible. Council to vote via email to proceed.
