We also had our families participate in the hanging of the greens worship that took place on November 27th. Many thanks to those families that helped us out.

December is full of different things happening. December 10th is our Cookie Walk from 2pm until 4pm here at Zion. The youth will be here to help our eager customers load up on freshly baked treats from you, our congregation members. As attendance to community events continues to rise we will be in need of several people willing to bake for us. Please see the information about the cookie walk on the adjacent page. Both youth groups will meet on December 11th for their monthly gatherings. December 16th and 17th brings one of the highly anticipated events by our Jr and Sr high youth – the Christmas lock-in is an experience. Our 7th through 12th graders will be locked in the church overnight and share an evening full of games, music, movies, food, fellowship, and fun. It is an excellent opportunity for youth to start new friendships and to strengthen those relationships that have already been formed.

I ask that you keep our youth of Zion and myself in your prayers. The time that they have these days is very important and our youth make the conscious choice to be here with us. With so many other opportunities in their lives it is great to have them make the choice to be here in faith and fellowship with each other. May you all have a wonderful Christmas season and God bless you all.

# Have yourself a Holy little Christmas

The "Christmas season" seems to begin earlier every year. Some stores had Christmas stuff on the shelves weeks before Halloween. What madness! We go dashing through the stores to the beat of Jingle Bells; and we go "Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree" until we crash from exhaustion.

Revelry and gift-giving are fine and fun, but if we're not careful they can snowball out of control. Stewarding a Holy and meaningful Christmas means balancing the commercial with the spiritual. Here are some tips:

**Observe Advent:** The four weeks before Christmas Day comprise the Advent Season, a time to prepare for Christmas through prayer, song, worship, and spiritual disciplines. Lean into the spirit of Advent. Advent devotionals can help (I recommend Richard Rohr's Preparing for Christmas).

**Observe the Christmas season:** The church calendar lists the season of Christmas from Dec. 24 to the feast of Epiphany on Jan. 6. Until the 20th century, these 12 Days of Christmas were the time for celebration and partying. Make them special in your life and family.

**Cut the consumerism:** Limit your shopping and spending by setting a strict budget or gifting the people in your life with homemade presents, favors, or ways to spend time together.

**Party hardly:** For some, Christmas is an excuse to overeat and drink to excess. Moderate your consumption.

Most importantly, pray: Ask God to help you and your family craft a meaningful and joyful Advent and Christmas. Ask God to send you wisdom, resources, and people who can journey through the spiritual season with you.

By carefully stewarding your faith life, Advent and Christmas can be a time for real spiritual growth.

#### Zion Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes

#### DATE: October 18, 2022

**Present:** Al Abruzzese, Kim Alloway, Andrew Doerr, Trevor Hoffman, Pastor Janyce Jorgensen, Jill Lordan, Wade Markel, Denise Moyer, Regina Peckmann, Jim Rowlands Amy Schanbacher, Tim Smith.

Excused: Ryan Engleman, Krista Meluzio-Zellers

**Devotions:** In lieu of our customary devotion on chapters in Luke, this month former Deputy Michael Lutz and his wife Diane spoke about their charity Team Deputy Lutz and the calling they received to provide assistance to wounded PA Law Enforcement personnel. 22 officers have been helped since the charity was founded in 2018. Next month's devotion will be by Regina Peckmann on Luke 17 & 18.

**Thank You Cards:** Thank you card to be sent to Pastor Lori Babcock and Pastor Richard Eckert for their service during Pastor Jorgensen's sabbatical. Regina to write the card.

**Email Vote:** In the interval between the September and October meetings there was an e-mail vote and the proposed list of inactive members to be notified of being removed from the rolls and the letter to be sent. There are a total of 67 families affected. The list and letter were approved by a majority of council, all who responded voted in approval.

**Minutes:** The minutes from the September 20, 2022 meeting were submitted by Jim Rowlands. The minutes were approved as submitted on motion by AI Abruzzese, seconded by Jill Lordan.

**Treasurer's Report:** Wade Markel presented a preliminary September, 2022 treasurer report. There is an inconsistency in the year to date spreadsheet that he will work out with Denise. There was no vote on the preliminary report.

**Investment Treasurer Report:** Trevor Hoffman submitted the September, 2022 report. The only transaction was Joyful Noise posting surplus into their designated account. There is approximately \$1,800 in the Council Benevolence Designated fund available for distribution.

**Membership Report:** Denise presented the attendance report. Pastor Jorgensen recommended for removal: Paul and Nancy Sharp. The motion was seconded by Jill Lordan and approved. Pastor Jorgensen also recommended for membership: Herb Snook. The motion was seconded by Regina Peckmann and approved.

**Pastor Janyce Jorgensen's Report:** Pastor Jorgensen submitted a written report. Christmas services are being planned for 5:30 and 10:00 pm on Christmas eve, 10:00 am on Christmas day, and an outdoor Carol / Lesson service on Tuesday, December 20.

**CYFM Report:** Chuck Bissell submitted a written report. There were no questions to take back to Chuck on his report.

**Parish Administrator's Report:** Denise Moyer submitted a written report. She has recruited three volunteer nursery attendants and is still looking for a fourth to establish a monthly rotation.

#### **Old Business**

- All old business was tabled for the month.

#### **New Business**

- **Council Retreat** - The council retreat with Dr Albert tentatively scheduled as part of the January and February council meetings.

- Racism Awareness Group - Nothing new to report.

- **175th Anniversary** - Jill Lordan gave a report. Everything is in place. Looking for assistance on the Saturday before for set-up. Costs are approximately \$3,500 for Mission BBQ and \$200 for desserts.

- **Draft Budget** - Trevor Hoffman presented a draft budget to council. The suggestions received since the September meeting were incorporated. The budget projects a deficit of \$71,500 versus the surplus the last few years due to PPP and tax rebate. Jill Lordan made a motion to approve the proposed budget and to present to the congregation at the annual meeting. Al Abruzz-ese seconded. The motion was approved unanimously.

- Second Rostered Leader: Jill Lordan obtained a copy of our previous Ministry Site Survey for updating. Council agreed to begin forming a call committee for a second rostered leader. The plan is to maintain a second rostered leader potentially for a finite time based on congregation growth. The decision to form a call committee will be announced during the Congregational meeting. Parallel with the call committee's work, council will plan for the additional expenses of an additional rostered leader.

- **Stewardship Campaign** - we will be working with Pastor Richard Jorgensen and other churches from the synod, probably beginning early next year.

- **Annual Meeting** - Preparations are beginning for the Annual Congregational Meeting. Jim Rowlands and Tim Smith are the council representatives on the Nominating Committee. Two additional members are required. There are three nominees needed for 2023. The congregational meeting will be in-person only this year. There will be a coffee social that morning. Council members will be needed from 9:30 on to man the sign in table.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord's Prayer at 9:10 on motion by Trevor Hoffman, seconded by Kim Alloway.
