Acts 2:1-4


#### Dear Friends in Christ,

The Ukraine family joined us in worship on Sunday, May 14th. Thank you for making them feel welcome! The family has been working hard to get acclimated and settled in their new country. Vova started a new job early in May and he is excited to be working at Legacy Innovations making display platforms, wood for the car interiors and other wood working projects. The owner's brother was transporting him to and from work until they were able to provide him a company truck to travel between shops and to take home after hours.

Olena was offered a cafeteria job at the middle school which will start in August and is walking distance from the house. She is excitedly waiting for the formal offer from the vendor. She will work from 8:00 a.m. till 1:30 p.m. and will be available when Mila returns home from school each day.

Sasha had an interview with an Electrical company who would like to hire him. However there are safety issues since the US wiring/voltage is a bit different then in Europe. There is a proposed a plan to work with a Ukraine subcontractor to train Sasha in his home language for a few months and then the company would hire him. Still waiting to hear if this plan will be put into action.

Mid-May the adults started ESL classes twice a week. The family was also able to purchase a car and they are the proud owners of a used Ford Fiesta.

### Treasurer's Report (Wade Markel)

We are 25% through 2023 with income of \$35,076.83 (90% of the March 2023 budget) and expenses of \$41,038.99 (99% of the March 2023 budget). The current surplus/deficit for 2023 is at (\$12,039.99) deficit and we were budgeted to have a (\$13,624.00) deficit at the end of March.

We currently have a "sweep" checking account, and we are going to keep it as long as it is profitable for us.

Motion to approve Treasurer's Report by Regina Peckmann. and seconded by Jill Lordan. Motion passed.

### Investment Treasurer's Report (Trevor Hoffman).

Will be looking to do an RFP for the investment accounts to determine if we should stay with PNC. Will be soliciting RFPs from 5-7 companies and will be soliciting advice from others in the congregation with financial backgrounds.

ELCA CD will be renewed in July 2023.

Report now reflects International Missions Fund was "zeroed out" and will be deleted from report in the future.

**Membership Report** (Pastor Janyce) No items requiring action. Report accepted as written.

**Pastor Janyce's Report.** Report accepted as written with no discussion. No action items.

**Parish Administrator's Report** (Denise Moyer). Report accepted as written with no discussion. Action items discussed below.

### CYFM Report (Ryan Engleman).

Lutheran Camper Organization – paying 50% of the cost for the first-year confirmands for the Confirmation Camp. There are a lot of children taking part in this – it either needs to go in his budget for next year or there should be a fundraiser. It is likely that he will be fundraising for the campers in the future. For now, Chuck just wanted us to be aware of future plans and/or needs. For 2023, funds will likely come out of the Breakfast Campers/ Scholarship Fund but engaging in fundraising for future years.

### Old Business.

### Performance Reviews.

Pastor Janyce's review is complete with Al Abruzzese, Jill Lordan and MaryJane McCluskey handling.

Staff reviews are in progress. Pastor Janyce and Mary Jane McCluskey will handle Denise's review and Denise and Pastor Janyce will handle the remaining staff members.

### Call Committee/Rostered Leader.

Ministry Site Profile was drafted, and the first draft was disseminated. Denise provided the statistics for demographic information. Website is challenging and is not user friendly. Jill pulled information from various sources for the trends. Giving seems to be steady while dipping somewhat during the pandemic. Pastor Janyce has reviewed, made some corrections and provided some input into the MSP. We reviewed the Ministry Site Characteristics and voted on what we believe we are like as a congregation. We reviewed the MSP in detail. Need to request sample of a job description so we can prepare one specific to us. We will need to work on 75 word description of job, which is portion to be publicized.

**Constitution.** We are close to having it ready to review. Committing to have it ready for Council for the May meeting.

Family arrived on Sunday. Welcome meal was prepared. Appointments over the next few weeks to get them acclimated to the local area. Questions or thoughts about helping may be passed on to Lori Wise.

This is an example of the small group scenario discussed with Kris Albert – may be an example to follow in encouraging involvement and service in the future.

**Easter Breakfast.** Went well. Well attended and plenty of food. per Andrew Doerr, he thought the Breakfast in 2022 was better when a larger number of Council members were present. If we are unable to staff it with Council Members, we may want to reconsider whether or not to hold breakfast.

**IT Services.** In Denise's report, there are various pricing options for Managed IT Services. Denise prepared a chart comparing Doceo, Treysta and performing the services in-house. Wade Markel made a motion to accept the quote from Doceo, which was seconded by Jill Lordan. Motion passed.

**Attending Synod.** Members registered: Wade Markel, Karen Bissell and Jen Morris.

**Small Groups/Visioning.** There was discussion on using small groups to reengage and focus on service agendas in the future. We need to harness individual talents to get them involved in the church and have them "engaged" in other activities associated with our future plans.

### Thank God for our families

[Jesus was dying on the cross.] When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." **-John 19:26-27** 

Last month we celebrate the mothers and mother figures, and then this month we celebrate our fathers and father figures. What a wonderful opportunity to honor the strong bond between parents and children. How strong? The first use of the word "love" in the Bible, Genesis 22:2, describes the connection between Abraham and his son, Isaac.

Family is a cherished gift from God that we are entrusted to treasure, love and nourish. As parents, we are responsible for raising children to become healthy adults. And as children, we are responsible for caring for our aging parents.

As Jesus indicates in the passage above, there need not be a blood connection for a parent-child relationship. In Matthew 12:46 -50, Jesus redefines family, saying that all who love and follow him are mothers, brothers, sisters, fathers. So, all of us are parent, child and sibling to one another. Now THAT'S some family!

As we honor the mother and father figures this spring, we can also challenge ourselves to be better stewards of the family bonds God has given us. We can explore how we can support families in our personal circles, our congregation and community – especially families that are troubled by great need, crises or dysfunction.

God ordained families to be the fundamental unit of human life. We can be good stewards of family relationships by caring for one another and helping everyone to grow into the faith family God intends.
