Dear Siblings in Christ,

I was looking over Martin Luther's Small Catechism, and I was reminded that in addition to providing a table blessing for the beginning of the meal, Luther also provides a Thanksgiving at the conclusion of the meal. I am guessing that you are not familiar with it, so here it is:

Similarly, after eating they should in the same manner fold their hands and recite devoutly:

"Give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is good, for God's mercy endures forever. God provides food for the cattle and for the young ravens when they cry. God is not impressed by the might of a horse, and has no pleasure in the speed of a runner, but finds pleasure in those who fear the Lord, in those who await God's steadfast love."


Then recite the Lord's Prayer and the following prayer:

"We give thanks to you, Lord God our Father, through Jesus Christ our Lord for all your benefits, you who live and reign forever. Amen"

While Luther was certainly a product of his time and used examples of his life experiences, we can appreciate the notion of taking time to pause and give thanks after a meal for the goodness of God. And, not just at the table, but in all aspects of our lives, may we be mindful of what God has done and is doing in our midst.

And, take a moment, after you experience a blessing from God, to give thanks and praise to the one who provides so richly for us.

July 23, 2023

The parable we hear this coming Sunday is about a field in which both wheat and weeds are growing—which is a way to describe the church, the world, and even ourselves. Come to worship, so that hearing the word and eating the supper of the Lord can nourish your "wheat" and stifle your "weeds."

This weekend event takes place at Camp Nawakwa September 22nd through the 24th. 6th through 8th graders from around different churches in the Synod gather for a weekend of fun, faith, and fellowship. This is another place where your children can see God at work on a grander scale. I know this runs along with fall sports BUT the lifelong benefits that this weekend delivers outweighs the sacrifice of one game (typically) on a filled sports schedule. I know, this is a bold statement that I am making but these aren't my words. These are the words of the families of the youth that have attended this event. So, prayerfully consider sending your 6th – 8th grader with me to Camp Nawakwa for Alive! 2023. God Bless you all and I will see you on Sunday.

As God's church, how can we work toward one unified body, all people welcome and affirmed, with the Holy Spirit activating our faith and equipping us to be better stewards of all God's gifts? Stewardship encompassing all of our gifts, with one of those gifts being financial resources. Currently we are having a \$3 a day challenge. Increase your giving by just three dollars per day. This

simple act will serve to support our shared ministry throughout this year, as we live into how God is calling us to serve today.



At the annual congregational meeting in November of 2022 the Church Council announced that Zion would be starting the process of filling our Pastoral vacancy and calling a Second Pastor to serve with Pastor Janyce.

In March, council appointed a Call Committee that is representative of who we

are as a congregation. The committee is chaired by Katelynn Strittmatter and the members are Richard Sheibley, Nancy Rossi, Lori Wise, Barb Reed and Matt Engleman.

The Call Committee and Council met with our Synod representative and we are pleased to announce that the first step in the call process, submitting a Ministry Site Profile to the Synod, was completed on Monday June 12, 2023. This will then let Pastors, who may be seeking a call, know that we have started our search and allow the synod to look for matches for Zion.

The next step is the synod getting potential candidate names and profiles to the Call Committee. This could take weeks to months (we are hoping for weeks). The Call Committee will review potential candidates and interview and make a recommendation to the Council and then eventually the congregation.

Please know that if you have any questions as we move through this process, you should reach out to any Call Committee member or Council member.

Ukraine



The Patiuk and Hrebinets families are settling into a routine in York. The adults are attending English as a second language classes 2 nights a week. Sasha was hired by Legacy Innovations as a mechanic which is the same employer as Vova. We are finishing up the finger printing and criminal background checks paperwork for Olena's job at the Mid-

dle school and Polina is looking for a job.

Now that the first utility bills, in their names, have arrived we have started working on budgeting and selecting utility suppliers. Every week we go through the mail and sort out what to keep and respond to and what to throw away. The medical insurance company has been chosen and then we identified a primary care provider for each person as well



as setting up appointments with specialists. Next is dental care.



Mila had her last day of school and the other coordinator took the ladies on a day trip to Washington DC and visited the Zoo and had a picnic lunch on the mall. We also took them to the Library's Summer Quest kick off celebration and Mila got her first library card. This summer Mila is signed up for two weeks of camp through the school district and is attend-

ing the free Tennis for kids program at her local school.

May 16, 2023, Meeting Discussion:

Opening Devotions: Al Abruzzese. We only have so much time and we need to recognize that there are only small windows to take action and we should take advantage of those opportunities before we regret not taking them. God's love is something we are called to put into action in our everyday lives when we experience it. Al brought this to our attention in light of the sudden and tragic passing of Kevin Stout's son, Charles. We should act on "big" things as well as little things. Example is to fight for justice even if justice means a small victory. God's love is for action ... we are compelled to take action and make the world a better place. Let's be people of action and be blessed.

For June: Kim Alloway ... continuing in this format.

Camper Fund Presentation (Chuck Bissell & Theresa Hanley).

Played video of Ryan Engleman describing confirmation camp and the importance of going to confirmation camp. A very peaceful, non-judgmental corner of the world. The experience was one of acceptance and validation. The friends you make at camp are special. You are able to open up more than you would with everyday friends because there is no judgment or concerns that you will be ridiculed. It has the effect of making the camper feel like they will always have a safe place to go. You learn a sense of peace and happiness. There is faith teachings, scripture teaching and references and it is taught in a way that you want to continue learning and reading the Bible. The camp made Ryan want to come back to Church following the pandemic.

Chuck and Theresa – Ryan really sells the camp and "fills them up" with respect to why the camp is important. Per Theresa, confirmation camp is required in her church to be confirmed. It's not just Sunday School for a week. It's a special experience. Confirmation camp encouraged Theresa to want to help out with youth ministry. Estimated cost of camp for one (1) week per camper is approximately \$450.00. It is anticipated that this will be the cost for the next 2-3 years. Discussion re: budgeting and fundraising for Confirmation Camp for the confirmands in the coming years.

Reports.

Thank You Cards.

None for this month.

Minutes from April 2023 (Amy J. Schanbacher).

Jill Lordan: Jill also participated in the pastoral review for Pastor Janyce as well as adding Mary Jane McClusky's surname to the first bullet point. Jill Lordan motioned to approve the motion with the corrections, seconded by Wade Markel. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report (Wade Markel)

We are 33% through 2023 with income of \$34,206.22 (75% of the April 2023 budget) and expenses of \$37,452.53 (94% of the April 2023 budget). The current surplus/deficit for 2023 is at (\$15,280.77) deficit and we were budgeted to have a (\$8,158.64) deficit at the end of April. Current envelopes for April are very low and far under budget. The envelopes for April were only 68% of what was budgeted, which causes concern and something we should monitor in the future. Motion to approve Treasurer's Report by Trevor Hoffman and seconded by Regina Peckmann. Motion passed.

Investment Treasurer's Report (Trevor Hoffman).

Report submitted as written.

Starting RFP process with Finance team for investment firms to manage accounts. Hoping to send the RFP out in early June. Denise inquired about giving some of the Council Benevolence fund to the Lutheran Auxiliary. To be addressed next month.

Membership Report (Pastor Janyce) No items requiring action. Report accepted as written. Of note, however, we are coming into a season of baptisms including granddaughters for Wade Markel and Pastor Janyce.

Pastor Janyce's Report. Report accepted as written with no discussion. No action items.

Congratulations to Pastor Janyce for earning her certificate for the 60 hour training program with LuTMA (Lutheran Transitional Ministry Association).

Stewardship – every season, we are asking people to consider the \$3.00 per day challenge. Pastor Janyce is trying to model this by engaging in the \$3.00 per day challenge.

Do we want someone to come and talk to us about planned giving? Marianne Brock from ELCA Foundation would come discuss planned giving.

Parish Administrator's Report (Denise Moyer). Report accepted as written with no discussion. Action items discussed below.

CYFM Report (Ryan Engleman). Closing out youth groups this coming Sunday (May 21st). See discussion on camper funding above.

Old Business.

Performance Reviews.

They are on target to completed by end of May 2023.

Call Committee/Rostered Leader.

Council is being asked to reserve June 7th to review the Ministry Site Profile with the Call Committee and Pastor Martini. We will also discuss next steps as part of the Call process. Not everyone has to be present but requesting that Council attempt to be present. Jill Lordan: Edits to Ministry Site Profile made since last meeting based upon comments from Council as well as edits offered by Pastor Janyce. Looking to finalize at the June 7th meeting so that Call Committee can offer final edits and/or comments to the Ministry Site Profile. The Ministry Site Profile will not "go live" until the Synod reviews and approves it.

Stewardship. Holding Pattern.

Pastor Janyce will explore if Marianne Brock will want to come speak about planned giving.

Constitution. Jim Rowlands attended the meeting to provide an update on the Constitution. During COVID, we made a 10-year review of the Constitution and made some minor revisions. During this process, Denise Moyer realized that the ELCA Constitution had been revised and we need to bring the Zion Constitution into compliance with the ELCA Constitution.

Jim and Denise are now ready for Council to review the revisions to the Constitution. We are, in part, recommending that the By-Laws remain a separate document rather than part of the Constitution. A continuing resolution just requires a Council vote. It is believed that keeping these documents separate will streamline approving changes to these documents in the future.

Discussion as to recommended changes to the Constitution. Amy Schanbacher and Trevor Hoffman suggested the following language regarding restricted funds: Any all funds designated as "restricted" shall be maintained in accordance with the Zion Financial Policy as well as any and all legal documents restricting the use of those funds by Zion Lutheran Church.

Discussion as to minor changes regarding changes to the By-Laws as well as discussion as to minor changes to the Continuing Resolutions.

Council to review all proposed changes, discuss via email and approve by end of June 2023. Council to approve so that changes can be addressed at November annual meeting.

Ukrainian Family.

Family arrived in York. Father started working at Legacy Innovations and the grandmother will be working in a school cafeteria so that she is available for the granddaughter when she is not in school.

Grandfather may have a job opportunity based on training of US electrical requirements in his native language.

The family is starting their ESL (English as second language) classes.

Al offered God moment about how excited the family was to experience the music in church and how much they enjoyed the music and service. The Grandmother exclaimed they would be back next week!

Pastor Janyce visited with them at their home. They are an ideal family and motivated to do what they need to do and learn to adapt to our society. They are thankful for all the help. They continue to worry about the son/brother left behind who is in the military. They pray for him constantly.

New Business.

IT Services. Doceo has set up the computers and is ready to go.

Visioning. The Call Committee is part of our visioning and we need to remember this as we navigate that process.

Music Budget. Tabled to June 2023. Lainie Knaub is suggesting \$7,000.00 for 2023 (adjustment to budget). Waiting on final numbers to engage in a full discussion as to the music budget. The musician supply fund for contemporary services is more than half-spent at this point in 2023.

Budget increase is due to necessity to pay supply musicians as needed for worship.

Consider for the next meeting a new approach or adjustment to the 2023 budget. There are volunteers willing to help but they are not always available to help. Most problematic service in ensuring musicians are available is Saturdays at 5:00 PM. There have been inconsistencies with the Saturday service and music and there has been feedback about this.

Next meeting: June 20, 2023, at 7:00 PM
