Dear Friends in Christ,

#### LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KIT DRIVE Support our international school kit drive for 2023! This year, more than ever, we need your help!



Last year we exhausted our supply to complete 238 kits so this is a year of rebuilding. Take advantage of back-to-school supply sales now to help us fill our kits. To complete 250 kits in 2023, we need:

- **1000 Notebooks** (70-sheet, spiral wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose-leaf paper)
- 1000 Pens (Black or Blue Ballpoint Pens (no gel ink))
- 1000 Pencils (Unsharpened #2 Pencils with erasers)
- 200 Packs of Crayons (Boxes of 16 or 24 Crayons)
- **250 Rulers** (30-centimeter Rulers, or rulers with centimeters on one side and inches on the other)
- 250 Pencil Sharpeners (Individual)
- 250 Blunt Scissors (Safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 250 Erasers (2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Erasers)



Simply pick a School Bus posted in the Narthex at Zion, buy the items indicated on the tag and drop them off at the church with your school bus between August 1st and September 18th. Pictures/ details of the items needed are displayed by the school buses. The approximate cost for the quanti-

ty of items needed is marked on the tag. Of course, with inflation, these costs may be outdated so feel free to buy a lesser amount to fit your budget!

If shopping is not your thing, a donation of \$15 will help pay for supplies and/or shipping costs or a donation of \$25 sponsors a full kit. If you are making a monetary donation, make your check payable to Zion Lutheran Church, deposit it in a "Love" envelope marked "School Kits" or note it on your check if you don't have an envelope. #### Reports.

#### Thank You Cards.

Joyce & Howard Daniels – helped with putting back furniture after water leak (Regina Peckmann)

Barbara Howard – donation to Ukrainian family (Krista Zellers) We received thank you notes from everyone that was invited to be with us at the Lenten mid-week services including a thank you note from the Stout family (fruit basket) during their difficult time accepting the death of their son. Service for the Stout's son was very well attended.

#### Minutes from April 2023 (Amy J. Schanbacher).

Wade Markel motioned to approve the motion as presented. Seconded by Regina Peckmann. Motion carried.

#### Treasurer's Report (Wade Markel)

We are 42% through 2023 with income of \$30,995.74 (101% of the May 2023 budget) and expenses of \$41,847.34 (90% of the May 2023 budget).

The current surplus/deficit for 2023 is at (\$12,473.92) deficit and we were budgeted to have a (\$15,917.84) deficit at the end of May.

Addendum: sweep was net gain of \$137.60 for account (gross \$195.91 minus expenses of \$69.31). Current envelopes are up by about 15%. Encouraged by the increase in envelope donations. We are "on the sunny side". Motion to approve Treasurer

Report by Regina Peckmann and seconded by Andrew Doerr. Motion passed.

**Investment Treasurer's Report** (Trevor Hoffman). Report submitted as written. Nice gain over the last month.

**Membership Report (**Pastor Janyce) No items requiring action. Report accepted as written. Drop off in attendance to zero on the last weekend is due to the water damage and services being cancelled that weekend.

**Pastor Janyce's Report.** Report accepted as written with no discussion. No action items.

**Parish Administrator's Report** (Denise Moyer). Report accepted as written with no discussion. Action items discussed below. Check came for water damage. Paid for the plumbing and the remedial clean-up. Compleat is coming out on or about June 22, 2023, to schedule on the remodel from the water damage. Denise will be able to advise when all work/restoration will be done next month. If Compleat is unable to get the carpet clean, we can talk to the insurance company about paying to replace the carpet.

Shawn and Joyful Noise are having issues with their respective computers, and they need to be replaced in 2024 (or sooner).

#### CYFM Report (Ryan Engleman).

No verbal report. Ryan is at confirmation camp. Chuck Bissell's report accepted as written.

#### Old Business.

#### Stewardship.

Building a Culture of Generosity is getting ready to start a new cohort in late July. It's completely on-line. Starts in late July/early August and ends in November. Cost to register is \$600.00. Jim Rowlands and Amy Schanbacher are willing to be part of Stewardship campaign. Stewardship is an important part of congregational life, and we made a conscious decision to forego stewardship over the last three (3) years primarily because of the pandemic and impact on congregation members financially. Now, we need to return to stewardship and has been a large part of visioning discussions.

The Presenter we are looking at is Michael Ward. He would address stewardship in the church in this "day and age". Pastor Janyce intends to accompany the stewardship team as is Pastor Richard. We have approximately a month to figure out our team – ideally, we would like 6-8 people on our "team". Pastor Richard handles stewardship for the Lower Susquehanna Synod. Denise is willing to use her "Thrivent grant" to pay a portion of the registration fee. Pastor Janyce is also willing to use her "Thrivent grant" if they can be stacked to pay the bulk of the fee. This would then leave \$100.00 by us to cover for registration. We agree that we should move forward with this stewardship campaign. Kim Alloway will be reaching out to people to join the team. Pastor Janyce to assist with suggestions

#### Performance Reviews.

All are completed but Denise's review, which Pastor Janyce is scheduled with Mary Jane McCluskey.

#### Call Committee/Rostered Leader.

Ministry Site Profile is live. Deb Anderson served as our reference, and she completed the request form that she received within minutes of the Ministry Site Profile going "live".

**Constitution.** Denise circulated a summary of changes to the Constitution/By-Laws to be submitted to the Synod for approval. Of note, there is now a position description for the Parliamentarian. Next step is for the Congregation to approve the proposed changes at the November 2023 Congregational meeting. Submitting to Synod for review prior to Congregational meeting. Need to determine how we are submitting to Congregation and Synod as some changes only require one (1) vote and some require two (2) votes.

#### Ukrainian Family.

They are settling into a routine. They are settling into jobs and taking last steps to start employment (fingerprinting/clearances). They are setting up care providers. The daughter (Mila) is engaging in various activities, engaging in camps associated with school. Utility bills are coming in and they are learning how to budget.

#### New Business.

JEMS Scholarship. Kai Hetrick applied for the scholarship. We believe we offered \$250.00 last year as the scholarship amount. Andrew Doerr motioned to award Kai Hetrick a \$250.00 JEMS scholarship, which was seconded by Wade Markel. Kai has already performed in church twice. Motion passed.

**Visioning.** There is going to be a covered dish on July 30, 2023. The covered dish would follow the 10AM service at 11AM on Sundays. The first one would be July 30th. A continuation of us coming back together, building community and participation following the pandemic. We may do this 4-6 times per year. There are remnants of the Fellowship Committee that may be willing to help. Would not need substantial planning. Hoping it will get larger as we go forward.

**\$3.00 per day Challenge.** Encouraging people to try even if just for a season (such as season of Lent or for the summer). Hoping people who have done will be willing to offer their thoughts/ feelings on participating in the Challenge. This really does make a difference to the Church.

**Church Directory.** Example from Waynesboro, Virginia (200th Anniversary of Zion Luther Church in Waynesboro – Pastor Richard's first call) – they have a directory that they keep in the pews, which appears to be done "in-house". Photos and information submitted by Congregation members. Suggestion that we do the same. Sample from Waynesboro passed around. Per Denise, this could be done easily through the church management software. Some pictures are already in the software. It would not be difficult to complete. Denise would just need a jpeg from members to add their pictures. Information requesting updated contact information and pictures could go in next week's Announcements and potentially be ready for the fall. Asking for pictures and information

#### Staff Meeting Requests.

Rental request for Fellowship Hall space: Denise discussed a request to rent our Fellowship Hall space by a group opposing the use of the property adjacent to the Prospect Hill Cemetery. After a brief discussion it was decided to deny the request.

All Plastic-One Bag-Zero Waste: Laine has made a request: are we interested in being a collection place for the bags of recycling materials not typically collected for recycling? Denise shared a brochure for the project. A suggestion was made to coordinate efforts with Hayshire UCC since they are already participating. Kim suggested involving the youth in collecting the plastic recyclables, placing them in the green bags and transporting the items to the recycling center. It was decided that we could supply the congregation with the bags and interested individuals can participate in the program individually unless someone was committed to do more. Will follow up with Laine at next staff meeting.

Next meeting: July 18, 2023, at 7:00 PM

Motion to Adjourn – Al Abruzzese and seconded by Andrew Doerr. Meeting adjourned.
