
Dear Friends in Christ,

As Thanksgiving approaches this month, I was thinking about the tradition of going around the table, and saying what we're thankful for. This tradition has the tendency to focus our thanksgiving prayers on ourselves, giving thanks for what we have received. Martin Luther's Small Catechism lists all the things that God gives us, all the things that count as "daily bread" – food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, homestead, field, cattle, money, goods, a pious spouse, pious children, pious servants, pious and faithful magistrates, good government, good weather, peace, health, discipline, honor, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like. These are all the things for which we ask God in the Lord's Prayer, and they are all the things for which we give thanks on Thanksgiving (and hopefully every day).

In the passage above, the writer of this letter to Timothy urges us to offer prayer, supplication, intercession, and thanksgiving, not only for ourselves, but for everyone (especially the government officials!), and also on behalf of all people. Such a prayer forces us to set ourselves aside, and try to imagine ourselves in the place of another. What is it like, for example, for a president or governor to hold the weight of responsibility every day, taking blame and receiving little gratitude? It puts us as the pray-er into a position of humility, and requires us to remember that these people, too, are children of God, made in the image of God. November is also a month for our national elections. This year, let's not only exercise our right and privilege to vote, but also to hold in prayer those who are running and those who serve in government at all levels. With humility, let us remember that each and every one of us is a beloved child of God, for whom Christ lived, died, and was raised. And while we're at it, let's pray for that peace which surpasses all human understanding, that God's peace will reign in all corners of our world, especially in those places where there is conflict.

I am wishing you a wonderful November- may all you do this month be meaningful to you, and may you know that God loves you unconditionally.



July 18, 2023, Meeting Discussion:

Opening Devotions: (By Trevor Hoffman). For devotions, Trevor went back to an old Bible and looked primarily at the Book of James – Raising two children and encouraging them to look at something from another person's perspective to understand how someone may feel differently about the same thing. Forgiveness is far stronger as an asset than undermining another person or seeking retribution. Book of Worship belonging to Great Great Grandmother that has been passed down through family and from which we will say a prayer this evening – for Grace to love and serve God.

Reports.

Thank You Cards. None identified this month.

Minutes from August 2023 (Regina Peckmann).

- No changes.
- Andrew Doerr motioned to approve the motion with corrections. Seconded by Christy Bucks. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report (Wade Markel)

- Treasurer's Report to be deferred to next month when both August and September reports to be made available and voted on to allow additional time to review financials and resolve inconsistencies, particularly with the August 2023 expense column.
- The August surplus/deficit is accurate we had a surplus, which is a bright spot.

Investment Treasurer's Report (Trevor Hoffman).

- Previously emailed. No inflows/outflows other than to the JEMS account for the Mission Fund.
- The RFP committee met on August 28, 2023. Eight firms had been invited to submit RFPs to manage our investments. From there, committee narrowed it down to three (3) firms that presented on August 28th (Ameriprise, Janney and Questmont).

- All three organizations presented well. The committee was comfortable with each of the investment approaches and available options. Questmont had the highest fees. Ameriprise fees were in the middle. Janney's fees were significantly lower than any other firm that submitted a proposal. The committee had a lengthy discussion regarding the pros and cons of each option.
- The committee ultimately selected Janney and is bringing that recommendation to Council. The investments would be managed at Janney, by Zion member, Dave Brosend.
- Trevor Hoffman moves to proceed forward with the committee's recommendation to hire Janney as the new investment manager for Zion's portfolio and to allow the authorized signers to execute the necessary documents. Seconded by Andrew Doerr. Motions carried unanimously.

Membership Report (Pastor Janyce)/Pastor Janyce's Report.

- Pastor Janyce recommended for transfer are David & Susan Glass to a church in the Hooverville area. Wade Markel se-conded. Motion carried.
- Pastor Janyce recommended for membership Chris Owens. Trevor Hoffman seconded. Motion carried.
- Remainder of report accepted as written.

Parish Administrator's Report (Denise Moyer). Report accepted as written with no discussion. Action items discussed below.

CYFM Report (Ryan Engleman). No report.

Old Business.

Stewardship (Amy Schanbacher & Pastor Janyce).

- Building a Culture in Generosity. We are asking 100% of both the Stewardship Committee and Council to participate in the campaign, which does not mean that we are committing a significant financial contribution. It simply means that we will participate in the campaign in some fashion and give what may be comfortable for our families either financially or of our time.
- Challenge Gift. Explanation by Pastor Janyce. We have \$3,500.00 committed (and potentially \$5000) if we can meet the challenge of having at least 50 members fill out an intent card as to their participation in the campaign. The challenge gift will go to fund Confirmation Camp.

Call Committee/Rostered Leader (Kim Alloway and Pastor Janyce).

 Council met with the Candidate on Thursday, September 14, 2023, and the meeting went very well. The Call Committee had glowing recommendation for the Candidate and Council Members in attendance also voted unanimously to call the Candidate to Zion Lutheran Church.

- Kim Alloway sent a summary email to Council of draft call letter advising that he is the primary Candidate on Sunday, September 17, 2023.
- Letter advising the congregation will be mailed out on or about October 2, 2023. It is anticipated that the Candidate will preach at all three (3) services the weekend of October 21st and that a call vote will take place that weekend. Announcement to be made two (2) consecutive weeks at church services (which will need to take place on the weekends of October 7th and October 14th).
- Meet & Greet for the Candidate. Council members will likely be asked to contribute snacks or other pastries for the Meet & Greet.
- Can ask congregation members who will be out of town that weekend may have the option to participate in one service that weekend via Zoom and vote that way if needed to reach a quorum. Cannot use Facebook Live to do this.
- Andrew Doerr is willing to monitor the Zoom link for the 10AM service on the weekend the call is to take place.

Panther Pantry Food Drive.

- Will take place the last weekend in October. Will be announced in the coming services.
- Kim was approached by The Well and we may be doing another food drive for them.

Parish Administrator's Report.

- All restoration work is guaranteed (warranty) for one (1) year if there are issues.
- Resolutions are ready to be presented to Council and voted on they will be addressed at the October meeting.
- The projector cannot be repaired. It is believed to be the power source that has gone bad, which cannot be fixed considering its age. Probably best to buy two (2) new projectors. Repairs and new projectors would cost \$7.350.00. We do have a \$1,000.00 gift to use toward the projectors. Balance would be approximately \$6,350.00. There is \$10,792.00 for replacement costs in the budget for 2023. Price uses the current system we have but would allow for upgrades at a later date.
- Andrew Doerr moved to replace the two (2) projectors and take the funds (in addition to the gift) from replacement costs to pay for the projectors and moving the working projector to the back. Seconded by Pastor Janyce. There was some discussion. Motion carried.

Pastor Janyce's Report.

- Submitted as written.
- Potluck meal on the last weekend of October as the first one was successful.

New Council Members.

• Still looking for five (5) new members. We have one candidate but need several more.

Pastor Richard Jorgensen.

- This is Pastor Richard's third (3rd) Council meeting since Sunday. We are one of many, many Councils throughout the Synod. We present ourselves as a living sacrifice to God and lifted that up to God (from Romans). We are present to do God's work.
- Pastor Richard took the position with the Synod at various meetings was the expression that [the Church's] best days are behind us. Pastor Richard viewed this as a challenge to address the issues that troubled him the most and went about changing the system. I don't take joy in seeing people grieve or take a loss, but I do take joy in seeing people have hope in God. Be less afraid. We are always in need of being spiritually renewed ... the congregations doing this (as well as their rostered leaders) are the ones most likely to grow in all different ways.
- We should not make decisions based on fear or constantly living in fear ... we need to live into our hope as a church. If we cannot bear witness to our hope in Christ, then we are in trouble. Let's not be ruled by fear.
- Even though we are running at a deficit, we are doing remarkably well as a congregation, and we have the resources to continue forging forward. As we go through a transition, we are reminded to invite ourselves to live into faith and courage and recognize that there is a financial crisis in the aftermath of the pandemic, but we are also during many places turning the corner. Zion has a lot of positive things happening. Recognize that your gift matters no matter what that gift is and recognize that commitment matters.
- Expressed appreciation for partnership and leadership with Pastor Janyce. Pastors Richard & Janyce are committed to Zion and participating in our stewardship campaign as well as to Zion.
- The message we share with the congregation is that yes, this is a challenge, but we will meet that challenge with faith, strength, and commitment. We make a commitment, and we live into it (even when we die story for the road).

Andrew Doerr moved to close the Council Meeting. Seconded by Wade Markel.

Next meeting: October 17, 2023, at 7:00 PM

Motion to Adjourn. Trevor Hoffman moved to adjourn and was seconded by Wade Markel. Meeting adjourned.
