

### February 4, 2024

In Sunday's gospel reading, Jesus shows his power by healing Peter's mother-in-law, but he also chooses to have his power hidden from others. This year listening to Mark's gospel, we often will hear about Jesus as hidden in his weakness and crucifixion, but made known as the risen Christ to believers both then and now. The first reading is one of several in the Old Testament that likens the faithful to soaring eagles.

Join us for worship and the imposition of Ashes as we prepare for the 40-day journey to Holy Week and Easter.





**Opening Devotions:** (By Regina Peckmann). Feeling a huge dichotomy ... awaiting the birth of Our Lord but it seems like people Regina knows personally are struggling as well as the world. Regina shared a poem from Catholic school – I Believe in the Sun ... text found written on the wall of a cave near Cologne, Germany where Jewish people were hiding during WWII. To be able to find inner peace during the Holocaust demonstrates nothing is impossible when you have faith and believe in God. This seems like a very poignant poem for the entire world right now. - Pastor Tricia McMackin and Seminarian Jennifer Taylor for helping while Pastor Janyce has been recovering from knee replacement surgery.
- Barbara Reed for helping out at the 8:00 AM service this past weekend.
- We would also like to thank Pastor Richard for also helping during this time as well as his words prior to the Annual Meeting.

### Minutes from November 2023 (Amy J. Schanbacher).

• Andrew Doerr motioned to approve October minutes, which was seconded by Trevor Hoffman. Motion carried.

### Treasurer's Report (Wade Markel)

- Disseminated prior to the meeting. November: The 11<sup>th</sup> month of the year and we are 92% through the calendar year.
- Total income is \$35,969.61, which is 107% of the budget and expenses are \$51,959.81, which is 108% of the budget. Current deficit is (\$86,563.62) and we were budgeted to have a deficit of (\$71,499.00).
- October deficit is (\$13,776.49) and we were budgeted to have a deficit of (\$14,607.15).
- Need to update Statement of Financial Position to reflect that investment accounts are now with Janney Montgomery. November was a good month. There was an expense for the projectors.
- Regina Peckmann moved to approve the October Treasurer's Report and this was seconded by Andrew Doerr. Motion carried.

### Investment Treasurer's Report (Trevor Hoffman.)

- Disseminated prior to the meeting.
- November was a good month for the markets and the accounts are up.
- The accounts have been transferred to Janney. The gains on the accounts are up.
- Adam Strayer is to serve as Investment Treasurer starting in 2024. This is not a conflict of interest with Sarah beginning to serve as a Council member because Adam, is the Investment Treasurer but does not have a vote on Council.

# Membership Report (Pastor Janyce)/Pastor Janyce's <u>Report.</u> There will be five (5) baptisms on January 31, 2024. No one joined in November and no requests for removal.

Remainder of report accepted as written.

### **Comments from Pastor Janyce.**

- Pastor Janyce is grateful for the opportunity to take medical leave and received excellent care while off. She is grateful for all messages, cards, and everything done while she was off. Pastor Janyce thanked outgoing Council Members (Amy and Tim) for their service over their last two (2) terms.
- We entered the Call Process about fourteen (14) months ago and could not have envisioned a better outcome with Pastor Kevin being called to Zion. Pastor Janyce is hoping to be helpful to Pastor Kevin as the Church transitions. Pastor Janyce wants to complete her spiritual journey and leave well. She would like us to consider a transition team for planning things like Pastor Kevin's installation and celebrating both Pastor Janyce and Pastor Kevin. She will keep us posted on what they discuss when they meet hoping to meet later this week. Pastor Janyce intends to be fully engaged until her last day.
- <u>Comments from Pastor Kevin.</u> Pastor Janyce made a wise choice to rest and get better and now looking forward to discussions about moving forward and transitioning.
- **CYFM Report (Ryan Engleman).** Chuck Bissell submitted written report – accepted as written. Cookie Walk was a success ... tons of cookies and bakers. Kept Cookie Walk going through the weekend's services ... sold more cookies than in the past. Some left that are being kept for December 16<sup>th</sup> fundraiser. Pastor Kevin stayed this past weekend for all of the Youth Groups, and he reported that he had a lot of fun with all groups.

### Old Business.

### Stewardship (Amy Schanbacher & Pastor Janyce).

- Initial response was the best but a few more Intention Cards trickled in after the original deadline.
- We are trying to "Build a Culture of Generosity" so we will keep moving forward with building that culture. Program was a success.

• We may want to consider Legacy Giving (leaving money to the church as a legacy). Pastor Kevin did this at prior Church by hosting various individuals to come in and discuss end of life planning. Andrew suggested that we could potentially do this during our Lenten suppers and discussions.

### New Business

- <u>Parish Administrator's Report (Denise Moyer).</u> Report accepted as written. Action items discussed below.
- Denise handed out binders to the new Council Members as well as new lists with contact information and current Council terms.
- Back parking lights were not working properly. Electrician called. Timer needs to be replaced as well as porch lights in front and back, this has been completed cost was \$2766. Front lights also stopped working. They could not find the cause and needed to do a finding mission. They returned and found the light that was the issue and isolated it so all the others work. Problem is one light need bucket truck to check light, and find the problem which will be done at a later date. They also had to fix lights near the road. Cost is yet to be determined. Will likely be expensive and ballpark figure is at least \$3,000.00.
- Housing allowance Council is to vote the housing allowance numbers for 2023 & 2024. Salary does not change but we do need to allocate it properly. The amount is \$20,400.00 for Pastor Janyce and \$20,000.00 for Pastor Kevin.
- The vote for the 2024 housing allowance will take place in January 2024 for Pastor Kevin & Pastor Janyce.
- Andrew Doerr moved to retroactively designate the housing allowance for Pastor Janyce for 2023 as \$20,400.00, which was seconded by Christy Bucks.
- Trevor Hoffman noted that this was approved in the budget for 2023 that was approved at the 2022 Annual Meeting.
- Motion carried.

- Denise needs a new computer, which was included in the 2024 budget. Denise would like to go ahead and order the computer now to get 2023 pricing rather than waiting until prices go up again in 2024. Because it is already in the budget, Denise is authorized to go forward and order. Bill will become due in 2024.
- Personnel issue discussed with council and action plan was created.
- Al Abruzzese moved to authorize Denise to move forward with changing the cleaning person/cleaning service within the confines of what was budgeted for cleaning in 2024. Seconded by Andrew Doerr. Motion carried.
