


Dear Siblings in Christ,

Life with Jesus

Are you looking to grow your faith in the new year? Would you like a space to participate in engaging dialogue with other believers? Maybe you want to hang out somewhere while your children are in Faith Formation? If so, the adult Faith Formation class, "Life with Jesus" may be the answer. Each Sunday we gather in the choir room (first door to the left past the bathrooms, across from the nursery). We discuss questions based on scripture and share our insights and life experiences, offering support and encouragement to one another, grow in our own understanding, and practically apply the principles of how to live each day, according to Jesus. We will begin a study of the book of James. Most scholars believe the author of this book of the Bible, with its practical and to-the-point guide on how we should live, was Jesus' brother.

James combines lessons from the Sermon on the Mount and the book of Proverbs for his commentary. Pop in any Sunday and check it out. Each week is a stand-alone discussion, so come when you can. Notes from the discussion are emailed to the group weekly, so you will know what's going on whether

you are physically present or not. All adults are welcome! As a follow through on what we have learned from prior study, this group is launching a project to aid the homeless in our community.

What an amazing year 2023 has been! We had a phenomenal kickoff to our youth year in 2023 with a brand-new youth group launching (Kidz Konnection) as well as Club 456 and ZLCY. We have had four great months under our belts with thanks going out to the families that have made lunch for our youngest group and thanks to the congregation as a whole for your continued support.

This brings me to our January meeting. This has become one of our most loved sessions of the year. It is the month where the youth groups draw their Epiphany star words for the new year. You aren't sure what I am talking about? Let me explain. Just as the wise men followed the star to find Jesus and present him with their gifts, the youth draw an Epiphany star from a box randomly (I like to think it is the Holy Spirit at work). This star has a word on it. This word then helps to guide them through their life through the next year. This is their guide word in every aspect of their life whether it is their school life, family life, sports life, work life and faith life. The word is meant to be a daily reminder to them so they are instructed to keep it somewhere that they will see it daily. I know some keep it on their nightstand or on a bathroom mirror. Some, like me, keep it inside their phone case as a constant reminder.

Some of the words drawn last year by our youth were pardon, sharing, awareness, wonder and determination. My personal word for 2023 was "Friendship". I used this word as a guide to look deeper at the friendships that I had. Some friendships were unhealthy, and I was able to heal or prune those friendships. I also was open to new friendships this year and have made some significant new bonds over the last 12 months. Please feel free to ask me how I had the same word two years in a row and how that was a tough 2nd year.

All in all, the youth have really taken to this practice over my four years here. While the Epiphany of our Lord is January 6th, we will be drawing our new words for the 2024 year on January

14th. If any of you would like to join in on this practice, please send me a note or see me the following week after our meetings.

I want to wish you the best possible new year and may God remain a powerful presence in your life as you and your children are a powerful presence in mine. Happy New Year!

January 7, 2024

The gospel this Sunday is about Jesus being baptized by John the baptizer. The voice of God speaks from heaven, and the Spirit descends like a dove. January 21, 2024

The word "Epiphany" means "the showing forth of God," and the readings on the Sundays after Epiphany and our participation in the sacrament continue to show forth Jesus to be our God. This Sunday, Jesus calls the disciples—and us—to repent, believe, and follow him. And Jonah, after trying to run away, finally heeds God's call and preaches repentance in Nineveh, the capital city of Israel's enemy Assyria.

January 28, 2024

In the Gospel of Mark, the first person healed by Jesus had "an unclean spirit." So do we all; yet in baptism we receive instead the Holy Spirit. The second reading this Sunday is Paul's interesting discussion about whether Christians could eat meat that had been first offered to gods or goddesses. Since nearly all meat available in Corinth at that time had been first offered in a pagan religious rite, Paul offers his advice in this dilemma.

Opening Devotions: (By Wade Markel). A call on Monday evening changed his presentation and is now based on Thessalonians. Believers continue to progress in their faith. "The day of the Lord's return will come unexpectedly like a thief in the night For all children are the light of the day and do not belong to the darkness." There is an analogy here to the use of a calendar. Some people use a calendar only for big events and some guide their entire lives by a calendar. However, you cannot ever put some things on a calendar. Some of the biggest events cannot be calendared with precision ... a child's birth or a child's wedding or the death of a loved one. We cannot plan for some of the biggest days of our lives ... we need to remember our faith in God and if we live in the light, God will bring us through it. "Lord, help us give an amen to Your calendar" ... and "progress in faith.

Reports.

Thank You Cards.

- Kim took care of the Call Committee, Bishop Dunlop
- Kim identified several men who relined the parking lot and they should receive thank you notes. Wade volunteered to write these thank you notes.

Minutes from October 2023 (Amy J. Schanbacher).

• Trevor Hoffman motioned to approve October minutes, which was seconded by Wade Markel. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report (Wade Markel)

- Disseminated prior to the meeting. October: The 10th month of the year and we are 83% through the calendar year.
- Total income is \$32,960.06, which is 91% of the budget and expenses are \$40,249.02, which is 87% of the budget. Current deficit is (\$78,263.23) and we were budgeted to have a deficit of (\$71,499.00).
- October deficit is (\$7,288,96) and we were budgeted to have a deficit of (\$10,225.13).
- Andrew Doerr moved to approve the October Treasurer's Report and this was seconded by Jill Lordan. Motion carried.

Investment Treasurer's Report (Trevor Hoffman.)

- Disseminated prior to the meeting.
- Most of the funds have been transitioned to Janney at this point and the final funds will be transitioned shortly.
- \$40,559.00 was transferred to the operating budget to cover the deficit through the end of the year.
- This transfer was taken *pro rata* from all unrestricted funds.

Membership Report/Pastor Janyce's Report.

- Pastor Janyce recommended for membership: Richard Zendarski to be received by affirmation of faith. Motion to approve by Jill Lordan and seconded by Regina Peckmann. Motion carried.
- Remainder of report accepted as written.

Parish Administrator's Report (Denise Moyer). Report accepted as written. Action items discussed below.

• We still have a need for snow removal this coming winter. Denise obtained three quotes. They are listed in her report. It would appear that Albright Lawn & Snow is the cheapest at this time. Albright was recommended by the person handling the lawn during the summer months. Council agrees on Albright. • Janitorial concerns – not turning in hours in a timely fashion, not doing what has been asked and this is not the first time these issues have arisen. Denise to give a warning and likely to place an ad for a janitorial service.

CYFM Report (Ryan Engleman).

- National Youth Group meetings have started for youth planning on attending this trip in 2024. Parents met on November 13, 2023, to discuss fundraising ideas. It is anticipated that 9-10 youth from Zion will be attending the National Youth Gathering in New Orleans. Youth Groups being held on November 19, 2023.
- Question from Christy Bucks re: holding a Paint Night but checking with Council if it could held as a BYOB function. Council generally decides on a case-by-case basis and usually requests that the group hosting the events cleans up and removes all evidence of alcohol. Trevor Hoffman motioned that the Paint Night could be a BYOB event with the stipulation that all evidence of alcohol is cleaned up and removed from the premises. Seconded by Andrew Doerr. Motion carried. Hoping to do in January 2023. Hoping to use Central York Middle School art teacher.
- Regina Peckmann also suggested that they look into a coffee fundraiser. Regina and Christy Bucks to discuss this as an option.

<u>Old Business.</u>

Annual Meeting.

- Packets went out.
- Nominations for Council: Sara Strayer, Mary Jane McCluskey (two years), AnMarie Hazelton and Dr. David Schneider. Andrew Doerr will hold a second term (three years) and Jill to hold another term (three years).
- Budget with the intent cards, we have already achieved most of the increase in giving budgeted for 2024.
- Looking at the last six (6) years, three (3) of those years have been surplus years and three (3) have been deficit years.

Stewardship (Amy Schanbacher).

- Members have been submitting Intent Cards. To date, at least 76 received, with 24 indicating the increase in giving could start immediately.
- Giving is up 15% and annual fund increased by approximately \$30,000.00.
- Discussion on using Christmas offering to be used to pay for projectors (approximately \$7,000.00).

Panther Pantry Food Drive.

• Amazing donations – Panther Pantry received over thirty (30) full bags of groceries. Drive was very successful.

Church Directory.

• This was printed in a smaller format and placed in the pews at the beginning of the month.

New Business

Pastor Kevin Stout.

• We will need to plan installation. Given that we no longer have a budget to host events, we will likely hold a Pot Luck event.

Council Vacancy Updates/New Officers.

• Kim Alloway cannot serve as President again as a result of new position. She can finish her term on Council but not as an officer. We will need a slate of officers. Adam Strayer is interested in being the Investment Treasurer and we do not view this as a conflict of interest with Sara Strayer joining Council. Trevor Hoffmann to discuss whether Adam is willing to take on this role. We need a President, Vice President, Secretary and Parliamentarian.

December Meeting. Moved up to December 12th and will be a Pot Luck meeting.

Well Food Drive. To be held on November 19th. Looking primarily for diapers and formula.

Andrew Doerr moved to close the Council Meeting. Seconded by Regina Peckmann. Meeting adjourned and closed in prayer.
