

Dear Saints of ZION:

ZION is in the season of saying Goodbye and Hello. Just like the Beatles song, 'Hello, Goodbye' were "You say, Goodbye and I say, Hello, Hello, Hello." We are in the middle of saying a lot of goodbyes and hellos. John Hughes, Psychologist states, "I contend that saying 'Hello' and saying 'Good-bye' are the two major learning tasks all humans need to accomplish." He continues, "I would venture to say that 98% of all the people that have emotional problems, have them because they fouled up at either saying 'Hello' or saying 'Good-bye'

We need to continually work on saying Hello & Goodbye. We should look at how we say Hello and Goodbye in this process we can learn a lot about ourselves. Remember Hello & Goodbye are your transitions with people, things, and emotions but especially people we love. I'm looking at how I say Hello to all of you, and you're looking, at how to say Hello to me, Pastor Kevin and family. We are also looking at how to say Goodbye to Pastor Janyce and family, who we love dearly, as she retires. It is not easy, but it is necessary as we leave and begin new seasons in our lives.

Dr. John Fletcher of the Alban Institute states there are five major tasks to perform when you are saying goodbye

1. Taking Control of the Situation: One needs to take control of what is happening, as opposed to passively letting others dictate the way the goodbye will happen. Who are the people you need to give special attention to because the relationship has been difficult or troubled? Who are the special people with whom you want to visit personally to say goodbye? Who are the people you want to at least call? Which groups in your life or church do you want to drop in on before leaving?

- 2. Getting Your Affairs in Order: Make a will, take care of loans, debts, obligations, start giving away your things that you have accumulated and clean up. It is important to list things you need to do before you leave. If someone is leaving, you make sure you go out of your way to help the person get their affairs in order. It can be as simple as carrying boxes to the car or helping the person get organized.
- 3. Letting Go of Old Grudges: Life is too short to hold grudges, make time to clean the slate- forgiveness and reconciliation. We do not want to carry all the old grudges with us to a new place. Whether you are the one leaving or the one that is staying put, it is so crucial that you say goodbye on good terms, forgiveness, and love. Don't be too proud to ask for forgiveness or to give forgiveness.
- 4. Saying "Thank You": We need to say thank you to appropriate people. More than that, tell people what they meant to you, yes it might be emotional with lots of crying but you will feel so much better to show your appreciation. This can include the sharing of our disappointments and frustrations as well as the positive feelings of love, affection, caring, etc..
- Reason for Leaving: Be straight and clear about reasons for leaving.
 People normally carry a lot of sadness and guilt when a person or pastor leaves their life.

We need to be intentional about saying Hello and Goodbye- especially when we are arriving or leaving! In the New Testament we see the importance, life giving importance, of saying hello to Jesus Christ in our life; to know him in your life and make him known: preparing his way so others accept him. We also see the importance, life ending and world ending importance of saying goodbye. The end of our life or the end of time is coming, and we need to be ready for it, be prepared to say good-

bye. Martin Luther puts it this way, "Live as if Jesus was crucified yesterday, Live as if Jesus rose from the dead today and Live as if Jesus is returning tomorrow."






