

Dear Siblings in Christ,

I would like to express my deep appreciation for the amazing farewell celebration we shared together on February 25. Thank you to all of you for the personal touches and meaningful moments. The time we spent together that day was a wonderful affirmation of the ways we shared in life and ministry for so many years.

You provided me with a lifetime full of memories. I also want to thank you for the many personal greetings through cards, gifts, messages and sharing your gifts during the celebration. I am overwhelmed by your thoughtfulness and generosity. Realizing that contributions and gifts for the celebration came in so many ways, thanking each of you personally is not possible, as some of you contributed anonymously. Please know that I read, heard, and experienced every greeting and gesture, and was touched by each one.

My time at Zion was a huge part of my life in ministry, and I will always hold you lovingly in mind and heart. I will miss our relationship as pastor and people, which brought us together regularly in worship and service. Yet, as siblings in Christ, my love for you remains, as I am assured that God holds you close and in loving care.

Love in Christ, Pastor Janyce A Covenant of Closure has been signed by Christy Bucks, Council President and Pastor Janyce. For the congregation to move forward, we need to accept fully the authority and guidance of the succeeding pastor, even as we cherish the memory and leadership of the Pastor Janyce. For Pastor Janyce to live into her new life of retirement, Zion members and her need to surrender pastoral authority and pastoral ties with Zion church members. Below is a copy of the covenant. If you have any questions please feel free to speak with Christy or Pastor Kevin.

A Covenant of Closure:

Guidelines for the Relationship of a Congregation and Former Pastors

We believe that the Holy Spirit is acting when a pastor is called to serve God's people and also that the Holy Spirit is acting when it is time for that pastor to accept another call, including the call into retirement.

A healthy relationship between a pastor and God's people is often mutually enriching and joyous. While serving a congregation, a pastor is deeply involved in the lives of God's people, and it is appropriate that strong bonds of trust, friendship, commitment and interdependence develop.

However, when the Holy Spirit leads the pastor to a new call or into retirement, those relationships, however strong, must change for the future health of both the congregation and the pastor. For the congregation to move forward, its members need to accept fully the authority and guidance of succeeding pastors, both interim and called, even as they cherish the memory and leadership of the former pastor. For former pastors to live into their new lives of service or retirement, they need to surrender pastoral authority and sever pastoral ties with their former congregations and their people.

The following expectations will help clarify the new relationship between former pastors and congregations:

Congregations and Members:

- -Will not reach out to former pastors for professional pastoral care in times of emotional, spiritual, or physical need, but rather exclusively to their current pastor.
- -Will not invite or approach former pastors to perform or participate in pastoral acts, such as weddings, funerals, baptisms, home communions, etc., but rather exclusively the current pastor.
- -Will not seek the counsel of former pastors (or their family members) on matters relating to the congregation, including its worship life, finance, administration, leadership, or issues. Members will avoid talking with former pastors (and family members) about congregational matters.
- -Will not expect former pastors (or their family members) to retain membership in the church, to attend worship, or to participate in activities or events in the life of the congregation.
- -Will speak positively of former pastors (and their family members). As Martin Luther explains in the *Small Catechism*, the Eighth Commandment compels us to do so: "We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our

neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead, we are to come to their defense, speak well of them and interpret everything they do in the best possible light."


-Will, in continuing personal relationships, regard former pastors as friends only. Although it is proper to address any ordained minister as "pastor," in light of the new relationship members will remember that the former leader is no longer serving as *their* pastor.

Former Pastors:

- -Will politely but firmly refuse requests to provide ministerial care to former congregational members, instead referring them to the current pastor. For the health of the congregation and the integrity of the ministry of the current pastor, this rule will be without exception.
- -Will politely but firmly refuse all requests to perform or participate in pastoral acts, such as weddings, funerals, baptisms, home communions, etc., instead referring them to the current pastor. (Former pastors will respond to all such requests with an unequivocal "no" and not suggest that members ask the current pastor if it is okay. Such a request puts the current pastor in a very difficult position, creates an unhealthy triangle, and can set a dangerous precedent.)
- -Will decline to comment on matters relating to the former congregation, including worship life, finance, administration, interpersonal relationships, conflicts, or politics. Former pastors will counsel their family members similarly to decline. It is wise for former pastors to discourage members even from talking with them about congregational affairs.
- -Will move the official membership for themselves and all family members to another congregation. Former pastors and family members will refrain from attending worship or participating in regular events and activities in the life of the congregation.
- -Will speak well of the former congregation, its leaders, and its members. As Martin Luther explains in the *Small Catechism*, the Eighth Commandment instructs us to do so: "We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray, or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead, we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light."
- -Will, in continuing personal relationships, regard members of the former congregation as friends only. In light of this new relationship, former pastors will encourage former congregation members to address them by their given name. When they are addressed with the honorific of "Pastor," ministers will remind, as appropriate, former members that they no longer serve as *their* pastor.

Covenant of Closure

In order to promote a healthy closure to the ministry tenure of our departing pastor and a healthy beginning to the tenure of successor pastors, we the undersigned agree to do our best to abide by the conditions of this covenant. We will encourage others in our congregation and our families to do the same by making this covenant a public and living document.

Children, Youth & Family Ministry



What a difference one year makes. I am writing the April Herald article while we are amid Lent. The anticipation for the Good Friday lock-in, the egg hunt on Saturday and Jesus' resurrection on Easter still hang in the air. When you read this article, Jesus would have already risen and we will be in the middle of the Easter season.

This month I want to talk about an activity that Theresa and I did with the youth groups during the March meetings. We took a "prayer walk" around the church grounds. While there are multiple types of prayer walks ours was more of a spiritual walk where you can calm your body and your mind to connect spiritually with God. I do have to give all of the groups credit. They braved the wind and colder weather to participate in this experience. They were tough.


We left the church through the back doors in silence and maintained silence for the duration of the walk and through the writing down of their thoughts. We focused on the things that we saw, heard, smelled, and felt as we walked across the fields and paused in multiple places. We returned to the warmth of the church where we shared our answers with each other. The one thing that all the youth shared was that they felt peace and a calm while walking on the church grounds. They also felt closer to God.

I would encourage you to do this through your neighborhood or go for a walk in a neighboring town or city. Pay attention to your surroundings and remain silent. There is a peace to be found in the silence and it is much easier to hear God speaking to you when your own mind and voice is quiet.

The only other thing I want to bring to your attention is Camping Season. There are opportunities during the summer months for your kids to go to either Camp Nawakwa or Camp Kirchenwald.

Check the youth group board in the Fellowship Hall for the brochure or go to www.lutherancamping.org to check out the different types of camps and to register online. There is another sheet on the youth board that talks about what camp your child is going to this summer. Make sure you fill that out if you are already going. Maybe a familiar face will be the thing that gets your kiddo excited about going to camp. Zion also has the funds to pay \$100 towards your child's camp costs for a week. Please see me or Denise Moyer about how that will work. It has been a great year so far for youth ministry. Why not make it a great summer as well?





"Jesus, help me know You."

Throughout His ministry, Jesus taught men, women, and children from diverse cultural, social, and economic backgrounds. They heard His words and marveled at His miracles. They called Him teacher, healer, prophet, and miracle worker. They stood amazed, but many walked away unchanged. Though these men and women knew about Jesus, they failed to see Him as Messiah, Deliverer, Savior, and God in the flesh.

Like the crowds who followed Jesus, we can easily read the Gospel of John again and again, storing up more Bible knowledge. But Jesus invites us to experience something deeper. He doesn't ask us to know *about* Him; He invites us to personally *know* Him. He does not simply tell us the truth; He *is* the truth. In John 14:6 Jesus clarified, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

To know Jesus is to be changed by Jesus. We don't simply read His words; we know Him to be "the Word" (John 1).

"Jesus, help me make You known."

For those early Christ followers, being dramatically changed by knowing Jesus automatically made Jesus known to others.

The men and women who believed that Jesus was Messiah, the Son of God, allowed the gospel to transform their thoughts and direct their actions. Every aspect of their lives—from family to finances—looked different. God used a few faithful followers to impact the world for eternity, and He continues to work through people like you and me today.

As you allow God's Word to mold your thoughts, affections, and actions, the people around you will notice. I can't help but wonder, what if every Zion member committed to make Jesus known? Imagine the impact! And the beauty is we don't have to look far for opportunities. God calls and equips His followers to love, serve, and share wherever we are with the people already in our lives.
