Discover, embrace, and share your unique gifts as a valued member of our Zion community! As the apostle Paul teaches us, each of us has been given special talents meant to be shared with others. At Zion, we cherish the diverse gifts and abilities of our congregation members.

Uncertain about your own talents? No worries—dive into one of our teams and explore your potential. We know and trust that God will guide your way.

Paul tells us in Romans 12:4-8 "For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your[a] faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully. "

Join us in building a strong, faith-filled community where everyone, from the youngest child to the most seasoned adult, can grow in their relationship with Christ and each other.

Here are our five teams we pray you will join: Faith Formation; Fellowship; Property; Service Ministry; and Outreach.

Faith Formation Team:

At Zion, we build a foundation of faith, fun, and fellowship through Sunday faith formation, worship, youth groups, and service-learning activities for all ages. Our goal is to accompany individuals and families within our Zion community in their journey to become strong ambassadors for Christ.

Our ministry heavily relies on volunteers. Members of the Faith Formation Team may serve in a variety of ways. This can include:

- Supporting the Director of Family Faith Formation and Youth Ministry, by volunteering to support programming for youth from nursery through 12th grade. Including faith formation classes, VBS and much more!
- Providing faith formation opportunities for adults of all ages.
- Staffing retreats, and special programs throughout the year.

Fellowship Team:

At Zion we seek to be a welcoming, supportive, and unified community. The Fellowship Team is key to achieving this goal and fostering a spirit of community within our congregation. Zion recognizes that promoting church friendship and community is a vital piece of our church life together.

Members of this team will have the opportunity to:

- Support various initiatives, including promotion of mental, physical, and spiritual well-being through education and support.
- Organize socials and receptions.
- Support women's and men's groups.
- Plan and execute special events, such as Church Picnics, Chili Cook-off and others
- Provide support during funerals.

Property Team:

Our church building serves many both within our Zion community and in our surrounding community. The mission of the Property Team is to maintain, protect, and oversee all church property and equipment. Members of this team will work alongside the Parish Administrator and are vital in ensuring the church's facilities are properly maintained and safeguarded.

Members of this team will have the opportunity to serve in a variety of ways. Including:

- Assist with maintenance, repairs, and replacements.
- Make recommendations to the Congregation Council regarding the replacement, repair, and purchase of property and equipment.
- Perform planting, maintenance, seasonal work and environmental stewardship of all landscaping of the church.

Service Ministry Team:

The Service Ministry Team is the hands and feet of Jesus throughout Greater York Area, Pennsylvania, USA and the World. This team extends Christian compassion and ministry to those in need, including the ill, aged, orphaned, single parents and their children, the poor and underprivileged, the imprisoned, and anyone needing aid in body or soul. We seek to involve as many members and outside organizations as possible to meet these needs.

Members of this team will have the opportunity to:

- Provide active support in local service programs.
- Study social conditions, primarily within the local community, to address critical problems through thoughtful Christian discussion and the light of Christian truth.
- Bring proposals for action based on these studies and discussions to the Congregation Council.
- In connection with the Director of Family Faith Formation and Youth Ministry, this team will also provide service opportunities for youth.

Outreach Team: Lead- Pastor Kevin

The Outreach Team supports and promotes the congregation's local, national, and worldwide ministries. Through development programs and leadership this team will actively reach out to the community and focus on sharing the Gospel; inviting all to consider this congregation as their church home.

Team members will have the opportunity to:

- Integrate new members into congregation life through initiatives like New Member Orientation.
- Encourage the expression of Christian faith in daily living, focusing on the use of members' time, talents, and treasures.

- Develop evangelism, discipleship, and outreach strategies, including the "We Are Wednesday" night program, which encompasses a Prayer Group, GreifShare Group, Lutheran Discipleship Leaders, and a Book Club, Children's Time, Bible Studies, and small group formation.
- Collaborate with the Finance Committee on stewardship programs, capital campaigns, and preparing the annual budget for the congregation.

Remember every Christian has gifts. Paul teaches us this in 1 Corinthians 12:4-7 "God's various gifts are handed out everywhere; but they all originate in God's Spirit. God's various ministries are carried out everywhere; but they all originate in God's Spirit. God's various expressions of power are in action everywhere; but God himself is behind it all. Each person is given something to do that shows who God is: Everyone gets in on it, everyone benefits." The Message

Each Christian is given two vitally important gifts:


- The gift of faith received at baptism through the unconditional, loving, grace-filled forgiveness of God.

How did we get to August already??


It is Monday and I have just finished unloading my backpack in my office after returning from a week in New Orleans at the ELCA 2024 Youth Gathering. This was an amazing and exhausting week. Not just for me but for my amazing adult leaders, Karen and Theresa, and the 11 young adults we accompanied to the city. Every day beginning with the flight down was filled with laughter and excitement to see what was going to come next. Each day I saw growth in each of these young people. Growth that can only come from exploring a city with your peers amongst the rest of the 16,000 that emerged on a city in need of help. New Orleans welcomed us with open arms and open hearts to see their city through their eyes and the love that they have for it all. The cause began by one man to reclaim forgotten neighborhoods in East New Orleans by picking up the years of trash thrown around because there was no place else to put it and how Culture of Cleanliness was born out of a need to clean up these neighborhoods and to give the residents a chance to rebuild what was once lost.

We all experienced God moments throughout the whole week. Some of those moments came from the service project. Others came from the chance to walk around and speak to other teenagers from around the country. We even met the group that came from Hawaii. Even more God moments were discovered in the sermon by Bishop Ortiz from the Metro DC Synod. God was also experienced in the friendly faces and words of the residents of New Orleans. From the people we passed on the street to the servers that brought us food and drink, every person had a smile on their faces for us and kind words to follow. Personally, my God moment came from all the interactions from the entire week. I saw God in the smiles of strangers, in the hugs of friends not seen in a long while, in the random conversations with kiosk sales people and in the time spent with the amazing youth of this congregation. We shared a lot of laughs and personal moments

during our family time each night. My hope is that this experience has helped to strengthen the relationships between this amazing group and those relationships continue to grow over the years. It is so good to be home. It is so good to be back at Zion. Now, it's time to take this renewed spirit and get back to work. See you on Sunday!

Ephesians 5:15-20



LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF SCHOOL KIT DRIVE July 27th and September 18th

Please support our International School Kit drive for 2024!

This year, more than ever, we need your help!

Last year we completed 250 school kits (a) To complete our ambitious goal of 300 school kits in 2024, we will need the supplies listed below. Take advantage of back-to-school supply sales now to help us fill our kits.

***We especially need notebooks, and they go very fast when the back to school sales begin.

- 1,100 Notebooks (70-sheet, spiral wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose-leaf paper)
- 800 Pens (Black or Blue Ballpoint Pens (no gel ink))
- 900 Pencils (Unsharpened #2 Pencils with erasers)
- 225 Packs of Crayons (Boxes of 16 or 24 Crayons)
- 300 Rulers (30-centimeter Rulers, or rulers with centimeters on one side and inches on the other)
- 250 Pencil Sharpeners (Individual)
- 200 Blunt Scissors (Safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- 150 Erasers (2 ½" Erasers)

Simply pick a School Bus posted in the Narthex at Zion, buy the items indicated on the tag and drop them off at the church with your school bus between July 27th and September 18th. Pictures/details of the items needed are displayed by the school buses. The approximate cost for the quantity of items needed is marked on the tag. Of course, with inflation, these costs may be outdated so feel free to buy a lesser amount to fit your budget!

If shopping is not your thing, a donation of \$15 will help pay for supplies and/or shipping costs or a donation of \$25 sponsors a full kit. If you are making a monetary donation, make your check payable to Zion Lutheran Church, deposit it in a "Love" envelope marked "School Kits" or note it on your check if you don't have an envelope.
