When: October 2, 6:30-8:00 PM


**Duration:** Weekly ending on December 11 (skipping November 27 for Thanksgiving)

Live\*Learn\*Love Mentoring (formerly the York Conference of Lutherans Tutoring program) is seeking volunteers to mentor students on Monday (Christ Lutheran) or Tuesday (Union Lutheran) evenings during the upcoming school year! The students will come from Central York, York City, and York Suburban Schools.

The evening consists of a meal served at 6:00 PM to the children. Mentors arrive by 6:30. We will begin with a large group activity from a curriculum called "Overcoming Obstacles" (https://www.overcomingobstacles.org) which seeks to teach "soft skills" needed for success in school and in life. Mentors will participate in the large group, as well. Next, children will meet with their mentors to complete a fun extension activity (easy to do and provided to you) to reinforce the evening's concept. Mentors are encouraged to also use some time if available to read or practice basic math skills with their students as time allows. Games will also be available to further develop social skills. Then we will wrap up by 7:30 and parents will pick up their children.
