

Jesus said, "I was a stranger and you invited me in." Matthew 25:35. And so by these biblical teachings Jesus wants us to love immigrants and strangers who are our brothers and sisters desperately in need of our help.

A refugee is someone who has been forced to flee his or her country because of persecution, war, or vio-

lence. We recently learned of a family living in a Kenya refugee camp after fleeing the Sudanese civil war. They no longer have a home and the camp, which was set up to house 20,000 refugees, now has 80,000 people. This is the sister, niece and nephew of Del Akech Del who was one of the Lost boys of the Sudan war and came to the US in 2001 eventually studied at Gettysburg Theological Seminary and serves several communities.

For a refugee to come to the US they must be Sponsored by five US citizens and be fully supported. These sponsors formed a group called "Mustard Seed Ministry" which are from churches in Harrisburg, Lancaster and Zion Lutheran. The US government has given approval for the group to resettle a family.

The family's paperwork is being reviewed by the US government which can take 6 months to 2 years for a decision.

What can the Zion congregation do in the mean time?

- Pray for peace in war torn countries
- Pray for the family
- Pray that low cost housing can be obtained in Lancaster
- Prayerfully consider household items that you could donate.

I hope you have a great month of November and see you on Sunday!





#### 5. NEW BUSINESS

- 5.1 2025 Budget Proposal Presentation
  - Trevor Hoffman presented first draft of budget to Council. Final draft to presented to Congregation in November.
  - The first draft outlines a total deficit of -\$29,409.03, which is improved from the 2024 budgeted deficit of -\$89,013.85.
  - The first draft outlines 2025 total income of \$463,320.00 (church only), which includes a projected 15% increase in giving.
    - Investment draw not included in income.
  - Joyful Noise Preschool is projecting a \$13,000 decrease due to lower attendance numbers.
  - Benevolence is \$23,000, which remains the same as 2024.
  - Admin expenses remain the same as 2024.
  - Christian education remains the same as 2024.
  - Youth expenses include \$3,000 for National Youth Gathering.
  - Special events remain the same as 2024.
  - There is a cost increase in church property insurance and cleaning.
  - There is a cost increase with the Pastor to include a Sabbatical.
  - Technology costs remain the same as 2024.
  - Worship and music-supply musicians remain the same as 2024.
  - Payroll expenses have decreased from 2024.
  - Replacement expenses have increased from 2024 due to building repair/paint.
  - 3% salary increase for all church staff, except for Chuck Bissell due to 70% increase in his
    insurance coverage.
  - Staff keeping Portico benefits (disability, pension, and group life) but denying the
    Portico medical plan to change to AETNA medical plan to reduce costs while maintaining
    similar or better medical coverage.
    - Denial process requires follow-up to confirm staff have denied Portico medical plan.
    - Consider benefit options outside of Portico in future years so benefits and medical coverage are under same plan.
  - To balance budget:
    - To decrease expenses, options include cutting staff hours or positions, reduce current spending of \$3,000 per year on printing.
    - To increase income, options include increasing giving by 22% (\$2,450 more per month) instead of the 15% currently proposed.
  - Finance Committee member to return to October Council meeting with final 2025 budget.
  - Congregation meeting to present budget will be November 17, 2024.
