### O Holy Night: A Song for All Seasons

Do you know the story behind "O Holy Night"? It's one of those songs we may sing each year without knowing its powerful origins. If you know me, you know I love Christmas music, and "O Holy Night" is my favorite. Since childhood, I've cherished this song, but it wasn't until recently that I learned its story—and it moved me deeply.

The song began as a poem written in 1847 by a French poet at the request of a priest who wanted a special piece for Christmas Mass. Later, in 1855, a Boston pastor named John Sullivan Dwight translated it into English, and it was in this version that "O Holy Night" became a beacon of hope and change.

One verse stood out to Pastor Dwight:

"Truly He taught us to love one another, His law is Love and His gospel is Peace. Chains shall he break, for the slave is our brother, And in His name, all oppression shall cease."

Consider the context: America was on the brink of Civil War, and the division over slavery was widening. John Dwight, a staunch abolitionist, shared "O Holy Night" in his magazine, "Dwight's Journal of Music," where it resonated with abolitionists and gained popularity in the North. Yet many religious leaders rejected it. Even years after the war, Southern churches refused to sing the song or removed this verse, preferring to ignore the painful truth it proclaimed.

In many ways, we are still dealing with the effects of that reluctance to fully embrace Christ's call to love and liberation for all. Today, we have the opportunity to carry forward the message that this song so beautifully shares. Our call is to follow Jesus not just in word but in action, living out His love for all humanity.

This Christmas season, I invite you to take a few minutes to listen to "O Holy Night" in its fullness. Reflect on what it means to follow Christ's way of love and justice, to see every person as your brother or sister. Let this song remind us of our role in building a world where, truly, "all oppression shall cease."



Imagine a long, expansive, banquet table, with a place for everyone at the table. No one is turned away; everyone will enjoy the feast. This is a power-









#### 4. OLD BUSINESS

    - o 4 three-year terms and 1 two-year terms available
    - o Kim Alloway to present new Council member nominations to Council

#### 4.2 Congregation Updates

- Motion to approve Congregation Constitution Updates by Andrew Doerr, seconded by Dave Schneider. Motion carried.

#### 4.3 Budget 2025 Review

- Health care coverage went up; insurance broker believes a less expensive option may be available as of November 2024. Etna is budgeted as the most expensive option. To make it balanced with health care coverage- 22% increase in giving for next year-with 28.6% increase in giving.
  - Will need to ask Congregation to increase giving from \$30,000 to \$39,000.
- An increase in giving is required. If giving does not increase, the decision to cut staff will
  need to be made in June due to significant budget.
- 2023 Stewardship Campaign may have been around 10-15% increase.
- Deficit -\$33,802.68
  - Accept the budget of the rolling 9 month giving of current & plate and add 20%=deficit
  - Motion to approve 2025 Budget by Kim Alloway, seconded by Dave Schneider.
     Open discussion.
  - Can have an addendum during Congregation meeting with corrected healthcare coverage costs.
  - Discussion of presenting a balanced budget versus deficit budget; cutting staff would impact the growth of the church and volunteers would be required to fill duties; Congregation members would need to increase their giving and bring in new members to achieve zero-based budget.
  - Presenting to Congregation a budgeted deficit -\$33,802.68 which is a 20% increase of open plates and receipts this year.
  - Motion to amend motion to approve -\$33,802.68 deficit in 2025 Budget by Christy Bucks, seconded by Andrew Doerr. Motion carried.
- 4.4 "Stuff the Bus" November and December on hold due to Angel Tree and adopting families. To restart in January with rotation of current identified organizations.

#### 4.5 Teams Debrief
