### Zion Has Heart: Sharing Compassion Throughout the Year

As we step into February, our hearts are filled with love and compassion, inspired by the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. This month, we focus on **Zion Has Heart**, our annual initiative to extend the love of Christ to those in immediate need within our congregation and community.

Each year, Zion Lutheran Church receives calls from individuals facing urgent challenges—unexpected bills, delays in receiving benefits, or emergencies that threaten their financial stability. These are people who may not qualify for traditional assistance or who have fallen through the cracks of the system. Where do they turn in these moments of need? Many call the church, and when funds are available, Zion answers with love and support.

### Your Role in Making a Difference

During February, we invite you to prayerfully consider contributing to the **Zion Has Heart Fund**. Your donations directly support families and individuals in crisis, allowing us to be the hands and feet of Jesus in their lives.

### Almsgiving: A Call to Christian Compassion

As Christians, we are called to practice charity and compassion, reflecting the love of God in tangible ways. The Catechism teaches that charity is "the theological virtue by which we love God above all things for his own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God" (CCC, No. 1822). Almsgiving, as part of this love, is more than just monetary giving—it is an act of justice and mercy, connecting us with those in need and with God Himself.

Jesus' ministry serves as our example. He cared for the poor, the sick, and the marginalized, urging us to do the same. By giving alms, we say to those in need, "I see you, I care for you, and I offer this gift out of love for God and for you."

### A Reflection of Christ's Love

Supporting **Zion Has Heart** is an opportunity to live out the words of 2 Thessalonians 3:13: "And as for you, brothers and sisters, never tire of doing what is good." When we give to help others, we allow the light of Christ to shine through us, glorifying our Heavenly Father.

This past year, we provided \$7,039.91 in assistance to 28 families in need, covering expenses such as hospital tolls, hotel stays for the homeless, utilities, food, electricity, tires, and insurance. All funds were paid directly to service providers, landlords, or distributed as gift cards when necessary.

**Thank you** for being part of this mission of compassion and for having a heart that mirrors Christ's love. Let us continue to be a beacon of hope in our community, shining the light of God's love on those who need it most.

### Children, Youth & Family Ministry



I write these pieces each month and there are some months where it is a struggle to know what to write about. Do you want to hear about what the youth have done? Do you want to hear my random thoughts around youth ministry? Most of the time I end up letting the Holy spirit guide me in these articles. That is what is going to happen this month.

I was having a conversation with a youth ministry colleague about the lack of caring in her youth group with her older teenagers saying, "they don't get anything out of worship so why should they go." This question has come up a couple of times with our Zion youth whether it comes from a youth group discussion or a conversation during confirmation studies. Sometimes I will just ask the question, "Why do we worship?" to hear what their responses will be. I will listen to what they have to say but then I always offer my response.

I preface it by saying that a young Chuck Bissell was terrible at attending worship. I went when my mother and father wanted me to. When the choice became mine at the age of 18, I chose sleep over worship. Only as I became older did I realize that I chose poorly. When I think back on my early twenties, I had no connection to a congregation and not much of a relationship with God. I thought long and hard about this question when I started going to worship again. Here is my response.

How much does God do for you every day? Do you wake up in a warm bed? Is there food in your refrigerator and pantry? Do you go to school? Text/call your friends? Watch TV?? God has put a lot of wonderful things in your life every single DAY. Do you thank God for what you have? How can we thank God for the things and people he has blessed us with? How about 75 minutes of your life one day a week?

75 minutes to sing his praises; lift His name in prayer; share in communion with Him and the rest of your faith family in worship. 75 minutes where if you truly give of yourself, you will STILL get something out of that time. Is the sermon boring? If you listen hard enough you will find something in that message that stirs something up inside of you. You need to be open to the possibility of being changed. When I gave that time to worship, I found myself looking for more opportunities to have that continued feeling. I wanted to do more as a thank you to God but to also continue to feed my soul. This is why I worship. Why do you worship? I would love to know. Feel free to send me an email or grab me after a worship service and share your thoughts.
