

#### April 6, 2025

We are nearing the conclusion of Lent. This Sunday's gospel story is of Mary of Bethany who at the dinner table anointed Jesus' body, as if he were already dead. We gather together this Sunday, remembering the death of Christ, yet feasting on the life of his body in holy communion. This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. (Ps. 118:24) 1 Corinthians 15:19-26




Lenten Book Study Wednesdays March 12—April 12 11:00 AM
