#### A Holy Conversation: When Two Mothers Met

Dear Sibling in Christ:

During Holy Week, our attention was drawn to the suffering of Christ. But often overlooked are the silent griefs surrounding Him—especially those of His mother, Mary. In this fictional but prayerful reflection, we imagine a tender encounter between Mary and another mother—the grieving, broken-hearted mother of Judas Iscariot.

Though we do not know her name, we know her pain. She, too, lost a son during this sacred week—one to guilt and despair. This imagined dialogue helps us see the Cross not only as a place of pain but as a place where even sorrowing hearts may find grace.

#### Scripture Meditation:

"The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." —Psalm 34:18

Dialogue: "When Two Mothers Met"

A fictional reflection inspired by Holy Week

[Setting: A quiet garden outside Jerusalem, after the crucifixion. Mary sits

alone. Another woman approaches.]

Mother of Judas: May I sit with you?

Mary: Of course. Sit. The earth is heavy with sorrow today.

Mother of Judas: It is. I feel it pressing on my chest. I—I am the mother of Judas.

Mary: [Jolted, then softens] You are welcome here. You are a mother. And your heart is breaking, like mine.

Mother of Judas: They whisper his name like poison. Judas. I named him for praise, for hope. I raised him to honor God. What have I done?

Mary: You loved him. You watched him grow, just as I did with Jesus. You gave him your heart. That is not failure.

Mother of Judas: But he betrayed your son. Your Jesus. He handed him over with a kiss. [Voice breaking] And then—he took his own life. I have lost him forever.

Mary: [Places her hand gently over hers] We both lost our sons to the darkness of this world. But you must not carry all the blame. Judas made his choice... in fear, in confusion. But no mother should bear the full weight of her child's fall.

Mother of Judas: Do you hate him? Do you hate me?

Mary: No. How could I? Jesus forgave His enemies from the Cross. He would have forgiven Judas too—if only he had let Him.

Mother of Judas: Do you think... there is still mercy for him?

Mary: That is for God to decide. But I believe Jesus never stops seeking the lost. Even Judas.

Mother of Judas: Thank you... for seeing me. Not just as the mother of a traitor, but as a mother. A grieving one.

Mary: We are mothers. And in our sorrow, we are not alone. The Lord is near to the brokenhearted.

#### Closing Reflection:

In this Easter season, we remember that God's mercy reaches far deeper than human betrayal. Let us pray for all grieving parents, all wayward children, and for hearts broken under the weight of regret. May we be slow to judge, quick to forgive, and always open to the healing power of Christ.

## Children, Youth & Family Ministry



Hello there! This is the week of craziness known as Holy week and I need to get this article done along with the final prep for our Good Friday lock-in and egg hunt on Saturday morning. I typically use this month to "put a bow" on our youth ministry for the 24-25 season with a recap of what has happened and what is still yet to come. I will probably do this again, but I do want to say that the wrap up for this year hits a little different than the past years. Let's get into it.

April was phenomenal as we held our Good Friday lock-in that led to the Saturday morning egg hunt. With the limited amount of sleep that some of the youth get they truly bring the energy out for the kids that come out for the egg hunt. Speaking of the egg hunt, we had our largest number of participants in the time that I have been serving here. The excitement around this event and all the youth events was amazing. I am expecting great things when it comes to VBS this summer.

As far as upcoming events, May 18th is the last day for faith formation and for youth group. It will be a great day as usual. We will be combining our ZEAL meeting with the youth from St Matthew in York to close out the youth group season. As you are reading this, we will also be in the middle of First Communion lessons for five of our youngest members as they learn what it means when we receive the bread and wine/grape juice during Communion. Those classes began on April 27th, and they run through the last weekend in May. The youth will then receive their first official Holy Communion on June 1st during our 10am service. Please hold these youngsters in your prayers.

Our confirmation youth have one more retreat this year before they are done for the summer. Their retreat is happening May 10th from 9-4 and will be taking place here at Zion. They have had a busy year as they have been reading at our 10am service every Sunday since March. I think this is an important part of their faith journey to be able to read scripture during worship. My hope is that this time of reading encourages them to continue to volunteer over the summer and into the next school year.

One last thing that I want to lift up is Confirmation Camp. We will have 13 youth attending in tracks; three more youth serving as counselors; and Pastor Kevin, Maggie VanBrakle, and myself will be serving in varying track staff. This is the largest number of youth that I have ever had attending this confirmation camp and I am very excited for this week. Camp takes place from June 15th through the 21st. Please hold all of us in your prayers as this is an exciting week but also a very exhausting week.

#### 3. MEETING MINUTES AND REPORTS

- 3.1 The Meeting Minutes from February 2025 were submitted by Sara Strayer
- The minutes noted that the current income fell short by \$5,500 in February 2025, but that date should be changed to January 2025.
- Motion to approve with this amendment by Jim Rowlands, seconded by Kelly Kessler. Motion carried.

- 3.2 Treasurer's report submitted by Anderew Doerr
- February 2025 Operations (does not include preschool): Receipts (Giving) \$48,022.37, Expenses \$43,390.52, Surplus/Deficit \$4,631.85.
  - ♦ Monthly Budget: Receipts (Giving) \$41,814.81, Expenses \$51,172.44, Surplus/Deficit -\$9,357.63.
  - ♦ YTD Operations: Receipts (Giving) \$97,610.16, Expenses \$93,510.02, Surplus/Deficit \$4,100.14.
  - YTD Budget: Receipts (Giving) \$87,579.98, Expenses \$99,459.32, Surplus/Deficit -\$11,879.34.
- Question if the February monthly budgeted surplus/deficit is truly -\$9,357.63? Denise will pull the budget to confirm.

- Andrew Doerr shared a request on behalf of the summer mission trip. Based on 27 participants (now 30 participants) lodging will cost about \$4,230 and food will cost \$2,000. Thrivent grant to be used toward costs but asking for church to cover lodging costs.
- Motion to cover \$4,230 lodging costs with domestic mission fund by Andrew Doerr, Seconded by Kelly Kessler. Motion carried

#### Parish Administrator's Report submitted by Denise Moyer

- Easter push to get 30% (118) more people to attend Easter services, with a goal of 30% (35) of those people to come back for another event or service, and then 30% (10) of those who return to join as members within 12 weeks.
  - Zion members are being asked to invite people to attend a service.

#### Road Map Discussion-Grow 2030

- Objectives were reviewed and to be further examined and developed by task forces:
  - Christ Centered Connections: Look at current and future community organizations to partner with; VBS for families/adults; JNP mom bible study to start after Easter; women's retreat, family retreat, men's retreat; Valentine's Day date night; increased accessibility to church for door and parking; more restrooms.
  - ♦ Transforming Lives: Small groups and bible studies based on life stages and areas of interests, discipleship classes, more online opportunities; establishing training system for new leaders; measure goal by percentage of participation; point of emphasis on participation of 18–35-year-olds; faith formation for high school students; 6 weeks groups/leveled groups, as well as ongoing groups. Goal of training 6 new leaders each year.
  - Infrastructure for Generations: Upgrade worship space; build separate recreation building; develop multipurpose facility- conceptual design team to look at plans for rough order of magnitude for estimated costs by November and share with sub task force.
  - Inspiring Stewardship and Generosity: Continue sharing weekly financial reports with Congregation; keep reading thank you notes in services; new website with page on financials; Financial team suggested to put additional financial information in bulletin on rotating basis (based on when numbers are available); annual Stewardship campaign in October; annual pledge and pledge cards; Financial Peace University; legacy giving seminar (e.g., EMT, Thrivent, funeral director); make signups available at services for SimplyGiving; capital campaign in 2026.
  - Digital Identity and Presence: Enhance Online Presence-3 new logos to be generated and presented to Council by June 2025, survey and understand best practices of churches with strong digital presence focusing on user experience, content strategy, and web traffic optimization, website rebuild should be initiated by June

2025, brand identity package, ensure brand identity to be used across church. Increase Engagement- understand costs, modernizing live stream experience, podcasts, virtual bible studies, draft plan to be presented by January 2026. Streamline Communication-utilizing digital platforms, staff needs regarding communication, software application changes or expansion Q2 or Q3 ahead of November Congregation meeting.
